A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Part	5 of Article	8 of Char	oter 2 of Title	e 47 of the	Official Code	e of	Georgia
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- 2 Annotated, relating to retirement benefits for certain law enforcement personnel under the
- 3 Employees' Retirement System of Georgia, so as to increase the normal retirement benefit
- 4 formula for certain employees of the Department of Corrections, officers and troopers of the
- 5 Uniform Division of the Department of Public Safety, conservation rangers, alcohol and
- 6 tobacco officers and agents, officers and agents of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation,
- 7 enforcement officers of the Department of Transportation and the Department of Motor
- 8 Vehicle Safety, and employees of the State Board of Pardons and Paroles who possess the
- 9 power of arrest; to provide for retirement after 25 years of service without regard to age for
- such members; to provide for an election of participation; to provide for application and
- 11 payment of contributions; to provide for related matters; to provide conditions for an
- 12 effective date and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

14 SECTION 1.

- 15 Part 5 of Article 8 of Chapter 2 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 16 relating to retirement benefits for certain law enforcement personnel under the Employees'
- 17 Retirement System of Georgia, is amended by inserting at the end thereof the following:
- 18 "47-2-226.

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- 19 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 20 (1) 'Highest average compensation' means the member's highest average monthly
- 21 earnable compensation during a period of 24 consecutive calendar months while a
- 22 member of the retirement system.
- 23 (2) 'Qualified law enforcement officer' means any person who is employed as:
- 24 (A) Any person employed by the Department of Corrections whose full-time duties
- include the preservation of public order, the protection of life and property, the
- detection of crime, or the supervision of inmates and detainees, and any person who is

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a line supervisor of any such person. Such term shall include, without limitation, prison

- 2 guards;
- 3 (B) An officer or trooper of the Uniform Division of the Department of Public Safety;
- 4 (C) A conservation ranger of the Department of Natural Resources;
- 5 (D) An alcohol and tobacco officer or agent of the Department of Revenue;
- 6 (E) An officer or agent of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation;
- 7 (F) An enforcement officer of the Department of Transportation;
- 8 (G) An enforcement officer of the Department of Motor Vehicle Safety; or
- 9 (H) A parole officer or any other employee of the State Board of Pardons and Paroles
- who possesses the power of arrest.
- 11 (b) Any qualified law enforcement officer in service on June 30, 2004, may elect to be
- governed by the provisions of this Code section. Any qualified law enforcement officer
- who becomes a member of this retirement system on or after July 1, 2004, shall be
- 14 governed by the provisions of this Code section.
- 15 (c) An eligible law enforcement officer subject to the provisions of this Code section may
- retire at any time after attaining the age of 55 or upon accruing at least 25 years of
- 17 creditable service, and, upon retirement, such retiree shall receive the regular retirement
- benefits under this chapter, provided that he or she shall in any case receive a minimum
- monthly retirement benefit equal to 3 percent of his or her highest average compensation
- for each year of creditable service; provided, however, that no such member shall receive
- 21 a benefit in excess of 90 percent of his or her highest average compensation. Such member
- shall file an application therefor in a manner similar to that provided in Code Section
- 23 47-2-110.
- 24 (d) Any member of this retirement system subject to the provisions of this Code section
- shall contribute an employee contribution of 1 percent of his or her earnable compensation
- in addition to any other such employee contributions required by this chapter.
- 27 (e) Any member eligible to elect participation in the provisions of this Code section shall
- make application in writing not later than December 31, 2004. Such election shall be
- 29 irrevocable and shall govern any subsequent period of membership after a break in service.
- 30 (f) Any member who becomes entitled to benefits under this subsection and who transfers
- 31 to a position not covered by this subsection shall be governed by the provisions of this title
- relative to such subsequent position. The board shall calculate the amount of contributions
- made in excess of those required for the subsequent position and shall grant the member
- such creditable service as such amount warrants without creating any additional accrued
- 35 liability to this retirement system. Such member shall thereafter be treated for all purposes
- as if he or she had never been covered by this Code section."

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SECTION 2.

- 2 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2004, only if it is determined to have been
- 3 concurrently funded as provided in Chapter 20 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 4 Annotated, the "Public Retirement Systems Standards Law"; otherwise, this Act shall not
- 5 become effective and shall be automatically repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2004, as
- 6 required by subsection (a) of Code Section 47-20-50.

7 SECTION 3.

8 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
