

## Senate Bill 76

**AS PASSED SENATE**

**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT**

1 To amend Code Section 45-7-4 and Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia  
2 Annotated, relating to annual salaries of certain state officials, and relating to salary and  
3 allowances of members, so as to specify certain expense requirements; so as to provide for  
4 a temporary, 10 percent salary reduction for certain officials; to provide an effective date; to  
5 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Code Section 45-7-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to annual salaries  
9 of certain state officials, is amended by adding a new subsection at the end thereof, to be  
10 designated subsection (d), to read as follows:

11 "(d) Notwithstanding any provision of this Code section to the contrary, the annual salary  
12 being received on January 31, 2003, by the Lieutenant Governor, each member of the  
13 General Assembly, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro  
14 Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker Pro Tempore of the House of Representatives, and  
15 commissioners, constitutional officers, or such other officials in charge of a state agency  
16 shall be decreased by 10 percent. Such reduction shall remain in effect until December 31,  
17 2004. This subsection shall stand repealed in its entirety on December 31, 2004."

18 **SECTION 1.1.**

19 Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to salary and  
20 allowances of members, is amended by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

21 "(5) Any member of the General Assembly shall not receive the daily expense allowance  
22 for housing expenses unless the member submits a receipt."
