A RESOLUTION

1 Commending Louise Boyce for her remarkable life and outstanding career as a teacher; and
2 for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Louise Boyce was born on June 11, 1912, in Due West, South Carolina;
4 graduated from Agnes Scott College in 1934; received a master's degree in education from
5 Florida State University; taught school for many years in South Carolina, Florida, and
6 Georgia; and instructed students in English for two years in Ethiopia; and

7 WHEREAS, Mrs. Boyce at the age of 90 continues to be an active volunteer with Meals on
8 Wheels five days a week; with Recording for the Blind, a textbook-on-tape recording service,
9 four days a week; and with the Athens Regional Medical Center at least once a week; and

10 WHEREAS, Mrs. Boyce was named Retired Educator of the Year by the Athens Area
11 Retired Educators Association and is actively involved with the American Association of
12 University Women and with the Central Presbyterian Church of Athens; and

13 WHEREAS, she has received numerous professional, academic, and community service
14 awards and citations including the Outstanding Alumna award at Agnes Scott College; and

15 WHEREAS, Senior Week at the Capitol has been established to recognize the valuable
16 contributions older Georgians have made to our state and will be observed the week of
17 March 3 - 7, 2003; and

18 WHEREAS, the Georgia Council on Aging has chosen to honor Mrs. Boyce as a
19 Distinguished Senior Georgian of 2003 in recognition of her contributions to her community
20 and state and the positive role model she represents for young and old alike.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
22 recognize and commend Mrs. Louise Boyce as a Distinguished Senior Georgian for 2003.
