

Senate Bill 134

**AS PASSED SENATE**

**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT**

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 7 of Title 52 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
2 relating to general provisions relative to registration, operation, and sale of watercraft, so as  
3 to change certain provisions relating to definitions; to change certain provisions relating to  
4 classification of vessels and required equipment; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other  
5 purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Article 1 of Chapter 7 of Title 52 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
9 general provisions relative to registration, operation, and sale of watercraft, is amended by  
10 striking paragraph (22) of Code Section 52-7-3, relating to definitions, and inserting in lieu  
11 thereof the following:

12 "(22) 'Reportable boating accident' means an accident, collision, or other casualty  
13 involving a vessel subject to this article which results in loss of life, injury sufficient to  
14 cause incapacitation for at least 24 hours, or actual physical damage to property,  
15 including vessels, in excess of ~~\$500.00~~ \$2,000.00."

16 **SECTION 2.**

17 Said article is further amended by striking paragraph (1) of subsection (d) of Code Section  
18 52-7-8, relating to classification of vessels and required equipment, and inserting in lieu  
19 thereof the following:

20 "(1) Every vessel shall be equipped with and carry aboard, at all times, at least one Type  
21 I, II, III, or V (hybrid) personal flotation device for each person on board; provided,  
22 however, Type V (hybrid) devices are acceptable only when worn and securely fastened.  
23 In addition to the individual personal flotation device, each vessel 16 feet or more in  
24 length, except for ~~personal watercraft, as such term is defined in subsection (a) of Code~~

1 ~~Section 52-7-8.2~~, canoes, and kayaks, must at all times be equipped with at least one  
2 Type IV (throwable) device."

3 **SECTION 3.**

4 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
