A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 uniform rules of the road, so as to require motor vehicle operators to take certain precautions
- 3 when passing stationary authorized emergency, towing, recovery, and highway maintenance
- 4 vehicles; to provide for a penalty; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to uniform rules
- 8 of the road, is amended by inserting a new Code section to be designated Code Section
- 9 40-6-16 to read as follows:

- 11 (a) The operator of a motor vehicle approaching a stationary authorized emergency vehicle
- that is displaying flashing yellow, amber, white, red, or blue lights shall approach the
- authorized emergency vehicle with due caution and shall, absent any other direction by a
- peace officer, proceed as follows:
- 15 (1) Make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the authorized emergency vehicle if
- possible in the existing safety and traffic conditions; or
- 17 (2) If a lane change under paragraph (1) of this subsection would be impossible,
- prohibited by law, or unsafe, reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a reasonable and
- proper speed for the existing road and traffic conditions, which speed shall be less than
- 20 the posted speed limit, and be prepared to stop.
- 21 (b) The operator of a motor vehicle approaching a stationary towing or recovery vehicle
- or a stationary highway maintenance vehicle that is displaying flashing yellow, amber, or
- red lights shall approach the vehicle with due caution and shall, absent any other direction
- by a peace officer, proceed as follows:
- 25 (1) Make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the towing, recovery, or highway
- 26 maintenance vehicle if possible in the existing safety and traffic conditions; or

1 (2) If a lane change under paragraph (1) of this subsection would be impossible,

- 2 prohibited by law, or unsafe, reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a reasonable and
- 3 proper speed for the existing road and traffic conditions, which speed shall be less than
- 4 the posted speed limit, and be prepared to stop.
- 5 (c) Violation of subsection (a) or (b) of this Code section shall be punished by a fine of
- 6 \$500.00."

7 SECTION 2.

8 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
