

House Resolution 407

#### A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House Study Committee on Special License Plates; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, there are numerous special license plates in Georgia and a large number of bills  
3 before the House Committee on Motor Vehicles proposing to create more special license  
4 plates; and

5 WHEREAS, the numerous special license plates have created difficulties for law  
6 enforcement officers in attempting to identify and differentiate between the special license  
7 plates; and

8 WHEREAS, such special license plates give rise to confusion as to the intended destination  
9 or use of revenue generated thereby.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
11 there is created the House Study Committee on Special License Plates to be composed of 14  
12 members. The 11 members of the House Committee on Motor Vehicles shall serve on the  
13 committee. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three members of the  
14 House of Representatives as members of the committee. The chairperson of the House  
15 Committee on Motor Vehicles shall serve as the chairperson of the House Study Committee  
16 on Special License Plates.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a comprehensive study  
18 of the conditions, needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and  
19 recommend any action or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.  
20 The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem  
21 necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its  
22 duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The legislative  
23 members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8  
24 of the O.C.G.A. All funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come

1 from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives. The expenses and allowances  
2 authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more  
3 than five days unless additional days are authorized. In the event the committee makes a  
4 report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any,  
5 such report shall be made on or before December 1, 2003. The committee shall stand  
6 abolished on December 1, 2003.
