## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to criminal pro	ocedure,
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- 2 so as to authorize counties and municipalities to establish programs for compensation to
- 3 owners and operators of property which is damaged by graffiti; to provide that such
- 4 compensation may be in the form of cash compensation or services or materials or a
- 5 combination thereof; to provide for the establishment of such programs by ordinance; to
- 6 authorize the Department of Community Affairs to provide assistance and to authorize the
- 7 funding of grants; to authorize the requirement of restitution in criminal sentences; to provide
- 8 for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 9 purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 12 Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to criminal procedure, is
- amended by adding a new Chapter 15A to read as follows:
- 14 "CHAPTER 15A
- 15 17-15A-1.
- 16 This chapter is enacted pursuant to the authority of Article III, Section VI, Paragraph VI(f)
- of the Constitution which authorizes the General Assembly to provide by law for
- 18 compensating innocent victims of crimes.
- 19 17-15A-2.
- The governing authority of any county or municipality is authorized, but not required, to
- establish a program for compensation of the owners and operators of real property who are
- 22 innocent victims of the offense of criminal damage to property or any other similar

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1 criminal offense where the criminal conduct consists of unauthorized damage to property

- 2 by painting or marking graffiti or other similar matter thereon.
- 3 17-15A-3.
- 4 The compensation provided by a county or municipality under a program provided for in
- 5 this chapter may consist of:
- 6 (1) Cash compensation to the property owner to reimburse wholly or partially the costs
- of removing or covering over the graffiti or other matter;
- 8 (2) Services or materials or both provided by the city or county to assist the property
- 9 owner or operator in removing or covering over the graffiti or other matter; or
- 10 (3) A combination of such cash compensation and service or materials or both.
- 11 17-15A-4.
- 12 A program of compensation as authorized by this chapter shall be established by ordinance
- of the county or municipality. Such ordinance shall include a provision that no entitlement
- or right of action is created thereby and that such program shall be revocable or amendable
- at any time by future ordinance. Such ordinance may provide for:
- 16 (1) The conditions under which compensation will be provided, the type of compensation
- to be provided, and the manner in which such compensation shall be requested;
- 18 (2) Limitations on the total amount of compensation which will be provided to any
- 19 particular person or under any particular circumstances;
- 20 (3) Provisions for the pro rata reduction of compensation provided in the event that the
- 21 total amount of claims during a period of time exceed the total amount of compensation
- made available for such period of time by the county or city; and
- 23 (4) Other matters deemed necessary or appropriate by the governing authority.
- 24 17-15A-5.
- The Department of Community Affairs shall be authorized, but not required, to provide
- 26 technical assistance and other appropriate assistance to counties and municipalities
- establishing programs under this Code chapter. The General Assembly is authorized, but
- 28 not required, to appropriate to the department funds for the administration of this chapter
- and for grants to be administered by the department for purposes of this chapter.
- 30 17-15A-6.
- 31 Any court sentencing a defendant for a crime covered under this chapter may include in the
- 32 sentence appropriate provisions for restitution to a county or municipality operating a
- program under this chapter."

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## SECTION 2.

- 2 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 3 without such approval.

## 4 SECTION 3.

5 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
