

The Senate Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee offered the following substitute to SB 243:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 3 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
2 emergency management, so as to provide that the Georgia Emergency Management Agency  
3 shall establish and maintain a standardized, verifiable, performance-based unified incident  
4 command system; to provide for the development of and instruction in such command  
5 system; to provide for the implementation of such command system; to provide penalties for  
6 local agencies that do not establish such command system by December 31, 2004; to provide  
7 for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

10 Chapter 3 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to emergency  
11 management, is amended by adding a new Code Section 38-3-57 to read as follows:

12 "38-3-57.

13 (a) The Georgia Emergency Management Agency shall establish and maintain, in  
14 collaboration with all appropriate state agencies and volunteer organizations with  
15 emergency support function roles, and professional organizations that represent local public  
16 safety agencies, including the Emergency Management Association of Georgia, the  
17 Georgia Association of Police Chiefs, the Georgia Fire Chiefs' Association, and the  
18 Georgia Sheriffs' Association, a standardized, verifiable, performance-based unified  
19 incident command system.

20 (b) Such system shall be consistent with the Georgia Emergency Operations Plan and shall  
21 be utilized in response to emergencies and disasters referenced in the Georgia Emergency  
22 Operations Plan, including Presidentially declared disasters and states of emergency issued  
23 by the Governor.

24 (c) The Georgia Emergency Management Agency, in cooperation with the Georgia Public  
25 Safety Training Center, shall develop a course of instruction for use in training and  
26 certifying emergency response personnel in unified incident command.

1 (d) All local public safety and emergency response organizations, including emergency  
2 management agencies, law enforcement agencies, fire departments, and emergency medical  
3 services, shall implement the standardized unified incident command system provided for  
4 in subsection (a) of this Code section by December 21, 2004.

5 (e) Local agencies that have not established such system by December 31, 2004, shall not  
6 be eligible for state reimbursement for any response or recovery related expenses."

7 **SECTION 2.**

8 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
