A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Ms. Mildred Baker Robinson; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Ms. Mildred Baker Robinson was born in College Park, Georgia, the third child
3 and only girl born to Nettie and Elden Baker; and
- 4 WHEREAS, she attended elementary school in College Park, but because there was no high
5 school for black children in College Park in those days of segregation, she attended South
6 Fulton High School; and
- 7 WHEREAS, she was introduced to Jesus at an early age, and at the age of 12 she joined the
8 Friendship Baptist Church, where she sang in the choir and was otherwise active until she
9 married and moved to Atlanta, where she joined the New Springfield Baptist Church, where
10 she was also an active congregant and choir member; and
- 11 WHEREAS, for many years she was employed by the Atlanta Public Schools, where she
12 worked in the school cafeteria; and she was also active in her community and was secretary
13 of the North Avenue Civic Club; and
- 14 WHEREAS, in 1999, she joined the United Methodist Church and was the secretary of the
15 Sunday school; and
- 16 WHEREAS, in 1997, she joined the Dogwood Senior Center, where she is president of the
17 Site Council and is in charge of the meals.
- 18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
19 the members of this body recognize and commend the Ms. Mildred Baker Robinson for her
20 many achievements and accomplishments.
