

The Senate State and Local Governmental Operations Committee offered the following substitute to SB 327:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend an Act providing a new charter for the City of Temple, approved March 28, 1974
2 (Ga. L. 1974, p. 3609), as amended, so as to change the description of the city council
3 districts; to provide for definitions and inclusions; to provide for continuation in office of the
4 current mayor and city councilmembers; to provide for election and terms of office of
5 subsequent mayors and councilmembers; to provide for submission of this Act for
6 preclearance under the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended; to provide for related
7 matters; to provide for effective dates; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

9 An Act providing a new charter for the City of Temple, approved March 28, 1974 (Ga. L.
10 1974, p. 3609), as amended, is amended by striking Sections 2-2, 2-3, and 2-3.1 and inserting
11 in lieu thereof new Sections 2-2, 2-3, 2-3.1, 2-3.2, and 2-3.3 to read as follows:

"SECTION 2-2.

13 No person shall be eligible for the office of mayor or councilmember if that person is
14 ineligible for such office pursuant to Code Section 45-2-1 of the O.C.G.A. or any other
15 general law applicable to that office.

SECTION 2-3.

17 The city council of the City of Temple which existed on December 31, 2003, is continued
18 in existence, but on and after January 1, 2004, shall be constituted as provided in this Act.
19 The city council of the City of Temple so continued and constituted, sometimes referred
20 to in this Act as the 'council,' shall continue to have the powers, duties, rights, obligations,
21 and liabilities of that council as existed immediately prior to January 1, 2004. The
22 members of the city council other than the mayor shall be referred to as 'councilmembers.'
23

SECTION 2-3.1.

(a) The mayor and those councilmembers of the City of Temple who are serving as such on December 31, 2003, and any person selected to fill a vacancy in any such office shall continue to serve as such mayor and councilmembers until the regular expiration of their respective terms of office and upon the election and qualification of their respective successors. Before assuming office, the mayor and each councilmember shall take an oath before a person duly authorized to administer oaths. On and after January 1, 2006, the city council of the City of Temple shall consist of five councilmembers each of whom shall be elected to represent one city council district described in subsection (b) of this section, and the mayor.

(b) For purposes of electing members of the city council, other than the mayor, the City of Temple is divided into five city council districts. One councilmember shall be elected to represent each such district. The five city council districts shall be and correspond to those five numbered districts described in and attached to and made a part of this Act and further identified as Plan Name: templecc2r Plan Type: Local User: Gina Administrator: Temple.

(c) When used in such attachment, the terms 'Tract' and 'BG' (Block Group) shall mean and describe the same geographical boundaries as provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia. The separate numeric designations in a Tract description which are underneath a 'BG' heading shall mean and describe individual Blocks within a Block Group as provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia. Any part of the City of Temple which is not included in any such district described in that attachment shall be included within that district contiguous to such part which contains the least population according to the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia. Any part of the City of Temple which is described in that attachment as being in a particular district shall nevertheless not be included within such district if such part is not contiguous to such district. Such noncontiguous part shall instead be included within that district contiguous to such part which contains the least population according to the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia.

SECTION 2-3.2.

(a) In order to be elected as a councilmember from a district, a person must have that person's legal residence in that district and must have received a majority of votes cast as required by general law for that office in the entire city. At the time of qualifying for election as a councilmember from a district, each candidate for such office shall specify the

1 city council district for which that person is a candidate. A person elected as a
2 councilmember from a district must continue such residence in that district during that
3 person's term of office or that office shall become vacant.

4 (b) The mayor may reside anywhere within the City of Temple and must receive a
5 majority of votes cast as required by general law for that office in the entire city. The
6 mayor must continue to reside within the City of Temple during that person's term of office
7 or that office shall become vacant.

8 SECTION 2-3.3.

9 (a) The municipal general election for the City of Temple shall be conducted on the
10 Tuesday next following the first Monday in November of each odd-numbered year.
11 Councilmembers from Council Districts 3, 4, and 5 shall be elected at the municipal
12 general election in 2003, shall take office the first day of January immediately following
13 that election, and shall serve for initial terms of office which expire December 31, 2007,
14 and upon the election and qualification of their respective successors. The mayor and
15 councilmembers from Council Districts 1 and 2 shall be elected at the municipal general
16 election in 2005, shall take office the first day of January immediately following that
17 election, and shall serve for initial terms of office which expire December 31, 2009, and
18 upon the election and qualification of their respective successors. Those and all future
19 successors to the mayor and councilmembers whose terms of office are to expire shall be
20 elected at the time of the municipal general election immediately preceding the expiration
21 of such terms, shall take office the first day of January immediately following that election,
22 and shall serve for terms of office of four years each and until their respective successors
23 are elected and qualified.

24 (b) The mayor and councilmembers who are elected thereto shall be elected in accordance
25 with Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the O.C.G.A., the 'Georgia Election Code.'

26 (c) All elections shall be nonpartisan and no political party or body shall hold or conduct
27 primaries for the purpose of nominating candidates for mayor or councilmember. No
28 candidate's name shall appear on a general municipal election ballot with a political party
29 designation.

30 (d) Council Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, as they existed on January 1, 2003, shall continue
31 to be designated as Council Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, respectively, but as newly described
32 under this Act, and on and after January 1, 2004, such councilmembers serving from those
33 former city council districts shall be deemed to be serving from and representing their
34 respective districts as newly described under this Act."

SECTION 2.

1
2 The city council of the City of Temple shall through its legal counsel cause this Act to be
3 submitted for preclearance under the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended; and
4 such submission shall be made to the United States Department of Justice or filed with the
5 appropriate court no later than 45 days after the date on which this Act is approved by the
6 Governor or otherwise becomes law without such approval.

SECTION 3.

7
8 This section and Section 2 of this Act and those provisions of this Act necessary for the
9 election of the members of the city council of the City of Temple in 2003 shall become
10 effective upon the approval of this Act by the Governor or upon its becoming law without
11 such approval. The remaining provisions of this Act shall become effective January 1, 2004.

SECTION 4.

13 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
