13 and diplomacy, his keen sense of vision, and his acute sensitivity to the needs of the citizens
14 of his community earned him the respect and admiration of his colleagues and associates; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the untimely passing of this generous, unselfish, and devoted family man leaves
16 an unfillable void in the hearts and lives of his family and friends; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife of 41 years, Shirley Ritter, daughter Angela
18 Simonton, and son Kevin Ritter, and numerous other family and friends.
