A RESOLUTION

1 Commending the Tattnall-Evans Baptist Association on 100 years of service; and for other
2 purposes.

3 WHEREAS, on October 23, 2003, the Tattnall-Evans Baptist Association will celebrate 100
4 years of service to the citizens and communities in these two counties through the efforts of
5 members of its 24 missionary Baptist churches and the leadership of their pastors; and

6 WHEREAS, the association includes small rural churches as well as larger town churches
7 like First Baptist Glennville, Claxton First Baptist, Eastside in Claxton, and Reidsville
8 Baptist and has a full-time associational missionary who directs leadership development,
9 training, and church ministry and mission work that includes youth, adults, and seniors; and

10 WHEREAS, outreach services are a major focus of the association ministry and include the
11 provision of basic medical and dental checkups for persons less fortunate and more recently
12 an Hispanic ministry supported by three mission churches and a full-time pastor; and

13 WHEREAS, the local missionary Baptist churches teach young people principles and values
14 central to their development as mature, responsible adults and provide individuals and
15 families understanding, encouragement, comfort, and hope; and

16 WHEREAS, the Tattnall-Evans Missionary Baptist Association works with the Georgia
17 Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention to sponsor mission work in the
18 United States and around the world and its support benefits many mission endeavors.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
20 recognize and commend the Tattnall-Evans Baptist Association on its distinguished record
21 of 100 years of service to individuals, families, and communities through its 24 missionary
22 Baptist churches and their very dedicated pastors.
