## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend an Act creating a board of commissioners of Cook County, approved August 12,
- 2 1919 (Ga. L. 1919, p. 627), as amended, particularly by an Act approved March 28, 1986
- 3 (Ga. L. 1986, p. 5029), so as to provide for staggered terms of office for members of the
- 4 board of commissioners; to provide for transition terms of office; to provide for related
- 5 matters; to provide for the submission of this Act for preclearance; to repeal conflicting laws;
- 6 and for other purposes.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 An Act creating a board of commissioners of Cook County, approved August 12, 1919
- 10 (Ga. L. 1919, p. 627), as amended, particularly by an Act approved March 28, 1986
- 11 (Ga. L. 1986, p. 5029), is amended by striking Section 2 and inserting in lieu thereof a new
- 12 Section 2 to read as follows:
- 13 "SECTION 2.
- 14 (a) The members of the board of commissioners who were elected at the general election
- in November 2000 shall continue in office for the terms to which they were elected and
- until successors are elected and qualified as provided in this Act.
- 17 (b) The members of the board of commissioners of Cook County from Commissioner
- Districts 1 and 5 shall be elected at the state-wide general election in 2004. Such members
- shall take office on January 1 following their election for terms of two years and until their
- successors are elected and qualified. Successors to such members shall be elected at the
- state-wide general election in 2006. Such members shall take office on January 1
- following their election for terms of four years and until their successors are elected and
- 23 qualified.
- 24 (c) The members of the board of commissioners of Cook County from Commissioner
- Districts 2, 3, and 4 shall be elected at the state-wide general election in 2004. Such

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1 members shall take office on January 1 following their election for terms of four years and

- 2 until their successors are elected and qualified.
- 3 (d) Successors to members elected under subsections (b) and (c) of this section shall be
- 4 elected at the state-wide general election next preceding the expiration of such terms of
- 5 office and shall take office on January 1 following their election for terms of four years and
- 6 until their successors are elected and qualified."

## 7 SECTION 2.

- 8 It shall be the duty of the attorney for the governing authority of Cook County to submit this
- 9 Act for approval pursuant to Section 5 of the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.

## SECTION 3.

11 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
