## A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the Harold Mann Memorial Interchange on I-75 in Whitfield County; and for  
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the late former state Representative Harold Mann served Dalton and Whitfield  
4 County as a trusted public servant for more than 30 years, as a community leader, a Whitfield  
5 County Commissioner, a member of the Georgia Republican Party at the local, state, and  
6 national levels; and

7 WHEREAS, the late former state Representative Harold Mann served ably in the Georgia  
8 General Assembly for more than a decade; and

9 WHEREAS, the late former state Representative Harold Mann was actively serving his  
10 constituents and many others in this community and the State of Georgia during the 2001  
11 regular session of the Georgia General Assembly when he met an untimely death on  
12 February 3, 2001; and

13 WHEREAS, the late former state Representative Harold Mann lived and served for many  
14 years in the Carbondale community, and most importantly, his final resting place is in Cove  
15 Cemetery, only one mile from the Carbondale Road interchange at I-75; and designating such  
16 interchange in honor of his long life of public service would be a most fitting memorial.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 GEORGIA that the Carbondale Road interchange with I-75 in Whitfield County is hereby  
19 designated as the Harold Mann Memorial Interchange, and the Department of Transportation  
20 is authorized and directed to erect and mark signs so identifying the interchange.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
22 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the family of the late  
23 Representative Harold Mann.
