A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 40-5-33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 change of address or name on driver's license, so as to provide that a student in this state may
3 possess a driver's license showing the address of his or her parent or guardian; to provide for
4 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

7 Code Section 40-5-33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to change of
8 address or name on driver's license, is amended by striking said Code section and inserting
9 in its place the following:

10 "40-5-33.

11 (a) Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving a driver's license, shall move
12 from the address named in such application or in the license issued to him or her or when
13 the name of a licensee is changed by marriage or otherwise, such person shall apply to the
14 department for a license showing the correct name or address within 60 days. Failure to
15 change the name or address shall not deem the license invalid.

16 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this Code section, a person's
17 driver's license may show the current address of his or her parent or legal guardian if:

18 (1) The person is currently enrolled in a school in this state;

19 (2) The tuition charged by such school to residents of this state for the current period of
20 enrollment has been paid;

21 (3) The person has in his or her possession proof of payment of such tuition for such
22 current period of enrollment; and

23 (4) The current address of the parent or legal guardian is in this state.

24 Whenever such person shall cease to be a student enrolled in a school in this state, he or
25 she shall apply to the department for a license showing his or her correct address within 60
26 days."
