A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 20-3-519.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to

- 2 ineligibility for a HOPE scholarship or grant, so as to provide a short title; to provide that any
- 3 person who has been convicted of any felony or misdemeanor shall forever be ineligible for
- 4 a scholarship or grant; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

7 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "HOPE Scholarship Preservation Act of

8 2004."

SECTION 2.

- 11 Code Section 20-3-519.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to ineligibility
- 12 for a HOPE scholarship or grant, is amended by striking paragraph (5) and inserting in lieu
- 13 thereof the following:
- 14 "(5) Has <u>ever</u> been convicted of a felony offense involving marijuana, a controlled
- substance, or a dangerous drug as set out in Code Section 20-1-23 or 20-1-24 of the
- 16 'Drug-free Postsecondary Education Act of 1990,' provided that such ineligibility extends
- 17 from the date of conviction to the completion of the next academic term or misdemeanor
- offense. Such ineligibility shall be permanent;"

19 SECTION 3.

20 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
