A RESOLUTION

- 1 Acknowledging and expressing appreciation for the *New Georgia Encyclopedia*; and for
- 2 other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the New Georgia Encyclopedia is the first state encyclopedia in the nation to
- 4 be designed and conceived exclusively for publication on the Internet; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the New Georgia Encyclopedia is available at no charge to anyone with an
- 6 Internet connection as well as through Georgia libraries, media centers, and public schools;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, the New Georgia Encyclopedia tells Georgia's panoramic story its
- 9 achievements, challenges, diversity, and signal developments; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the New Georgia Encyclopedia will preserve for posterity the record and still
- unfolding story of Georgia's people, places, institutions, and events; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the *New Georgia Encyclopedia* will promote greater knowledge among middle
- and high school students about Georgia's history, government, archaeology, culture, folk life,
- 14 arts, religion, business, industry, philanthropy, and sports; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the New Georgia Encyclopedia will promote cultural travel and tourism and
- 16 thereby contribute to the economic development of our state; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the *New Georgia Encyclopedia* will build a greater appreciation of Georgia by
- 18 emphasizing the whole state's history of its towns, counties, cities, and communities; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the New Georgia Encyclopedia will become the principal tool for people
- 20 outside of Georgia who want to know more about our state; and

1 WHEREAS, the New Georgia Encyclopedia has been recognized by the National

- 2 Endowment for the Humanities as a national model; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the emphasis on readability and excellence will establish the New Georgia
- 4 Encyclopedia as a premier site on the World Wide Web.
- 5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that this body acknowledges
- 6 and expresses its appreciation to the Georgia Humanities Council, the Office of the
- 7 Governor, the University of Georgia Press, and the University System of Georgia/Galileo for
- 8 organizing, carrying out, and maintaining the New Georgia Encyclopedia for the people of
- 9 Georgia.
- 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body acknowledges the invaluable financial support
- extended to the New Georgia Encyclopedia by the State of Georgia, the Robert W. Woodruff
- 12 Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Georgia Power Foundation,
- 13 BellSouth, the Peyton Anderson Foundation, the James Cox Foundation, the UPS
- 14 Foundation, and the Historic Chattahoochee Commission.
