

Senate Bill 464

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 10-1-395 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
2 appointment and duties of an administrator for purposes of Part 2 of Article 15 of Chapter  
3 1 of Title 10, the "Fair Business Practices Act of 1975," creation of the Consumer Advisory  
4 Board, and relations with other regulatory agencies, so as to provide for processing of  
5 complaints; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Code Section 10-1-395 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to appointment  
9 and duties of an administrator for purposes of Part 2 of Article 15 of Chapter 1 of Title 10,  
10 the "Fair Business Practices Act of 1975," creation of the Consumer Advisory Board, and  
11 relations with other regulatory agencies, is amended by striking subsection (c) and inserting  
12 in lieu thereof the following:

13 "(c)(1) The administrator shall receive all complaints under this part. He; provided,  
14 however, that he or she shall not accept, file, or otherwise act upon any such complaint  
15 unless it is in writing; submitted by or on behalf of an identified aggrieved consumer; sets  
16 forth the problem in a chronological manner; and is accompanied by copies of documents  
17 relevant to the complaint such as invoices, contracts, or previous correspondence with the  
18 business or person who is the subject of the complaint.

19 (2) If more than 90 days have elapsed since the administrator accepted a complaint and  
20 the administrator has not determined that the subject of the complaint is using, has used,  
21 or is about to use any method, act, or practice declared to be unlawful under this part or  
22 by regulations made under Code Section 10-1-394 to be unlawful, the administrator shall  
23 deem the complaint unfounded, dismiss the complaint, and purge the complaint from the  
24 files and records of the office of the administrator.

25 (3) The administrator forthwith shall refer all accepted complaints or inquiries  
26 concerning conduct specifically approved or prohibited by the Department of Agriculture,

1 Commissioner of Insurance, Public Service Commission, Department of Natural  
2 Resources, Department of Banking and Finance, or other appropriate agency or official  
3 of this state to that agency or official for initial investigation and corrective action other  
4 than litigation."

5 **SECTION 2.**

6 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
