A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 46-4-160 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the  
2 authority of the Public Service Commission regarding certificated marketers, access to books  
3 and records, investigations and hearings, price summary, billing, violations, and slamming,  
4 so as to provide for a specific period of time from the mailing or posting of a bill for natural  
5 gas before the application of late fees or penalties on a consumer; to change the maximum  
6 late fee; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Code Section 46-4-160 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the authority  
10 of the Public Service Commission regarding certificated marketers, access to books and  
11 records, investigations and hearings, price summary, billing, violations, and slamming, is  
12 amended by striking subsection (h) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

13 "(h) A marketer shall render a bill to retail customers for services within 30 days of the  
14 date following the monthly meter reading. A marketer's bill shall utilize the results of the  
15 actual meter reading subject to paragraph (8) of Code Section 46-4-158.2. The price for  
16 natural gas billed to a natural gas consumer shall not exceed the marketer's published price  
17 effective at the beginning of the consumer's billing cycle. A marketer shall allow the  
18 natural gas consumer ~~a reasonable period of time~~ at least 34 days to pay the bill from the  
19 date the ~~consumer receives~~ marketer mails or electronically posts the bill, prior to the  
20 application of any late fees or penalties. Marketers shall not impose unreasonable late fees  
21 or penalties and in no event shall any such fees or penalties exceed \$10.00 or 1.5 percent  
22 of the past due balance, whichever is ~~greater~~ less."

23 **SECTION 2.**

24 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
