- 1 In memory of the life of George "Action" Jackson; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, George Jackson grew up in Thomaston, Georgia; and
- 3 WHEREAS, after finishing high school, Mr. Jackson joined the U.S. Navy, serving from  
4 September 1965 to November 1969 during one of our nation's greatest times of need; and
- 5 WHEREAS, he met his future wife, Joyce Morton Poythress, in 1971, and they would marry  
6 three years later in November of 1974; and
- 7 WHEREAS, in 1973, George joined the Atlanta Police Department, rising to the rank of  
8 homicide detective and retired from the department in 1998, only to later join the Georgia  
9 Building Authority Police where he was assigned to the Capitol; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Jackson moved on from the GBA and went to work for the City of Atlanta  
11 Traffic Courts, and he remained employed there until his passing; and
- 12 WHEREAS, his sense of humor, ease, and fun brought joy to everyone, and he will be deeply  
13 and sorely missed by all; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Mr. George Jackson leaves behind Joyce, his loving wife of 29 joyful years;  
15 three sons, Marcus Jackson, Anthony Poythress, and Bernard Poythress; two daughters  
16 Pamela Adams and Donna Poythress; and four glorious grandchildren; and
- 17 WHEREAS, George Jackson was dearly loved by his family and friends and respected and  
18 admired by his peers and everyone at the Georgia State Capitol.
