10 National Guard personnel and equipment in support of operations Noble Eagle, Enduring

11 Freedom, and Iraqi Freedom; and

WHEREAS, General Searcy began his military career in 1968 as a pilot with Savannah's 13 165th Military Airlift Wing of the Georgia Air National Guard and advanced through a 14 succession of senior command positions to the position of Wing Commander of the 900 15 member Airlift Wing in 1996; and

WHEREAS, he is a command pilot with more than 3,500 flying hours and has been involved
 in numerous world-wide missions, exercises, and deployments including support for Desert
 Shield and Provide Promises and

18 Shield and Provide Promise; and

WHEREAS, General Searcy is a distinguished Georgian whose contributions to the state and
nation are many and whose character represents the finest ideals of a citizen soldier.
