A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 20-2-285 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 timetable for implementation of promotion policy, so as to delay the implementation of the
- 3 Georgia Academic Placement and Promotion Policy for third graders for one year; to provide
- 4 for testing policies and procedures for the 2003-2004 school year; to provide for remedial
- 5 instruction, retesting, reports, and reporting subsequent test results separately for certain
- 6 students who fail the reading assessment in 2004; to provide for related matters; to provide
- 7 an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

- 10 Code Section 20-2-285 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to timetable for
- implementation of promotion policy, is amended by striking the Code section and inserting
- in lieu thereof new Code Sections 20-2-285 and 20-285.1 to read as follows:
- 13 "20-2-285.
- 14 The State Board of Education shall provide for a timetable of implementation of this Code
- section and the Georgia Academic Placement and Promotion Policy which shall include:
- 16 (1) The third grade beginning with the 2003-2004 <u>2004-2005</u> school year;
- 17 (2) The fifth grade beginning with the 2004-2005 school year; and
- 18 (3) The eighth grade beginning with the 2005-2006 school year.
- 19 20-2-285.1.
- 20 (a) This Code section will apply to students tested with the third grade criterion-referenced
- reading assessment in the 2003-2004 school year only.
- 22 (b) The third grade criterion-referenced reading assessment shall be given as required by
- other provisions of this chapter, but results of the test shall not be used in any way in
- 24 determining whether any student shall be promoted or retained at the end of the 2003-2004
- school year. Other promotional standards and criteria established by the State Board of

1 Education and the local school board, including but not limited to academic performance,

- shall be the basis for placement decisions for the 2003-2004 school year.
- 3 (c) Each school system shall provide remedial instruction for each student who does not
- 4 pass the third grade criterion-referenced reading assessment. Each school system shall
- 5 report to the Department of Education the number of students not passing the third grade
- 6 criterion-referenced reading assessment and the remedial instruction provided to such
- 7 students.
- 8 (d) Each school system shall retest each student who does not pass the third grade
- 9 criterion-referenced reading assessment. Each school system shall report to the Department
- of Education the number of students who pass and fail when tested for the second time.
- Each school system shall develop a plan of remedial instruction for each student who does
- not pass the test the second time, whether the student is in the third grade or the fourth
- grade for the 2004-2005 school year. Each school system shall report such plans for
- 14 remedial instruction to the Department of Education during the first month of the
- 15 2004-2005 school year.
- 16 (e) When reporting the results for criterion-referenced reading assessments in 2005 to the
- 17 Department of Education, each school system shall report test results for students who
- failed the third grade reading assessment in the 2003-2004 school year separately.
- 19 (f) The Department of Education shall report to the General Assembly on the results of the
- 20 third grade criterion-referenced tests in the 2003-2004 school year, remedial instruction for
- students, students who failed the reading assessment a second time, remedial instruction
- for such students, and subsequent test results for students who failed the reading
- 23 assessment once or twice."

24 SECTION 2.

- 25 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 26 without such approval.

SECTION 3.

28 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
