

## Senate Resolution 841

## A RESOLUTION

1 Commending the Georgia peanut industry and recognizing March 10, 2004, as Peanut Butter  
2 and Jelly Day at the Capitol; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, peanuts and peanut products are recognized throughout our nation and the  
4 world as an appetizing and nutritious food, providing protein and other nutrients as part of  
5 a well-balanced diet; and

6 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia leads the United States in peanut production, producing  
7 nearly 40 percent of the total supply in the nation. Further, our state leads the nation in  
8 peanut exports, supplying 30 percent of the U.S. peanut exports, contributing over \$90  
9 million toward our nation's balance of trade; and

10 WHEREAS, peanut production is the largest single cash food row crop in Georgia with gross  
11 farm receipts averaging over \$400 million for the past five years; and

12 WHEREAS, more than 250 Georgia companies engaged in warehousing, processing,  
13 manufacturing, and marketing totally depend on the peanut industry, and hundreds of other  
14 Georgia companies that engage in financing, supplying, distributing, and transporting are  
15 dependent to some extent on the peanut industry; and

16 WHEREAS, the Georgia peanut industry has played a significant role in the economic  
17 growth and prosperity of our state, contributing an estimated \$1 billion to the Georgia  
18 economy and supporting the livelihood of more than 150,000 Georgians.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
20 commend the peanut industry for its outstanding contributions to the economic health of the  
21 State of Georgia and recognize March 10, 2004, as Peanut Butter and Jelly Day at the  
22 Capitol.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed  
2 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia Peanut Producers  
3 Association.
