

House Bill 1682

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend an Act placing the clerk of the Superior Court and judge of the Probate Court of  
2 Elbert County upon an annual salary, approved March 10, 1959 (Ga. L. 1959, p. 2624), as  
3 amended, particularly by an Act approved March 26, 1980 (Ga. L. 1980, p. 4201), so as to  
4 change the provisions relating to the salaries of such officers; to provide an effective date;  
5 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 An Act placing the clerk of the Superior Court and judge of the Probate Court of Elbert  
9 County upon an annual salary, approved March 10, 1959 (Ga. L. 1959, p. 2624), as amended,  
10 particularly by an Act approved March 26, 1980 (Ga. L. 1980, p. 4201), is amended by  
11 adding at the end of Section 1 thereof the following:

12 "(c) The clerk of the Superior Court of Elbert County serving in such office on January 1,  
13 2004, shall continue to receive that person's salary pursuant to subsection (a) of this section  
14 as long as such person holds such office. All future successors to such person in that  
15 office, however, shall receive only that compensation established for such office by general  
16 law and not that established by subsection (a) of this section."

17 **SECTION 2.**

18 Said Act is further amended by adding at the end of Section 2 thereof the following:

19 "(c) The judge of the Probate Court of Elbert County serving in such office on January 1,  
20 2004, shall continue to receive that person's salary pursuant to subsections (a) and (b) of  
21 this section as long as such person holds such office. All future successors to such person  
22 in that office, however, shall receive only that compensation established for such office by  
23 general law and not that established by subsections (a) and (b) of this section."

1 **SECTION 3.**

2 This Act shall become effective on the first day of the month following the month in which  
3 it is approved by the Governor or in which it becomes law without such approval.

4 **SECTION 4.**

5 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
