

Senate Bill 625

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To create the Heard County Public Facilities Authority; to provide for a short title; to provide
2 for the membership and the appointment of members of the authority and their terms of
3 office, qualifications, duties, powers, compensation, and expenses; to provide for vacancies,
4 organization, meetings, and quorum; to provide for definitions; to provide for the powers and
5 duties of the authority; to provide for revenue bonds and their form, denominations,
6 signatures thereon, negotiability, and sale and use of proceeds from such sales; to provide
7 for interim documents and for lost or mutilated bonds; to provide conditions for issuance; to
8 prohibit the pledge of credit for the payment of bonds; to provide for trust indentures and a
9 sinking fund; to provide for payment of bond proceeds; to provide for bondholder remedies
10 and protection; to provide for refunding bonds; to provide for bond validation; to provide for
11 venue and jurisdiction; to provide for trust funds; to provide for the purpose of the authority;
12 to provide for rates, charges, and revenue; to provide for rules and regulations; to provide for
13 tort immunity; to provide for tax exemptions; to provide for supplemental powers; to provide
14 for effect on other governments; to provide for liberal construction; to provide for
15 severability; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
16 purposes.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

18 **SECTION 1.**

19 Short title.

20 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Heard County Public Facilities Authority
21 Act."

SECTION 2.

Heard County Public Facilities Authority.

(a) There is created a public body corporate and politic to be known as the "Heard County Public Facilities Authority," which shall be deemed to be a political subdivision of the state and a public corporation, and by that name, style, and title said body may contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, and complain and defend in all courts of law and equity. The authority shall have perpetual existence.

(b) The authority shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the Board of Commissioners of Heard County. With respect to the initial appointment by the board of commissioners, two members shall be appointed for a term of three years, two members shall be appointed for a term of two years, and one member shall be appointed for a term of one year. Thereafter, all appointments shall be made for terms of three years and until successors are appointed and qualified. Immediately after such appointments the members of the authority shall enter upon their duties. To be eligible for appointment as a members of the authority a person shall be at least 21 years of age, a resident of Heard County, Georgia, for at least two years prior to the date of his or her appointment, and shall not have been convicted of a felony. Any member of the authority may be selected and appointed to succeed himself or herself.

(c) The Board of Commissioners of Heard County may provide by resolution for compensation for the services of the members of the authority in such amounts as it may deem appropriate; provided, however, that such members shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties.

(d) The members of the authority shall elect one of their number as chairperson and another as a vice chairperson. The members of the authority shall also elect a secretary, who need not be a member of the authority, and may also elect a treasurer, who need not be a member of the authority. The secretary may also serve as treasurer. If the secretary or treasurer is not a member of the authority, such officer shall have no voting rights. Each of such officers shall serve for a period of one year and until his or her successor is duly elected and qualified.

(e) Three members of the authority shall constitute a quorum. No vacancy on the authority shall impair the right of the quorum to exercise all of the rights and perform all of the duties of the authority.

SECTION 4.

Powers.

The authority shall have the power:

(1) To have a seal and alter the same at its pleasure;

(2) To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, condemnation, or otherwise, and to hold, operate, maintain, lease, and dispose of real and personal property of every kind and character for its corporate purposes;

(3) To acquire in its own name by purchase, on such terms and conditions and in such manner as it may deem proper, or by condemnation in accordance with the provisions of any and all existing laws applicable to the condemnation of property for public use, real property, or rights or easements therein, or franchises necessary or convenient for its corporate purposes, and to use the same so long as its corporate existence shall continue; and to lease or make contracts with respect to the use of or dispose of the same in any manner it deems to the best advantage of the authority, the authority being under no obligation to accept and pay for any property condemned under this Act, except from the funds provided by authorization of this Act; and in any proceedings to condemn, such orders may be made by the court having jurisdiction of the suit, action, or proceedings as may be just to the authority and to the owners of the property to be condemned; and no property shall be acquired under the provisions of this Act upon which any lien or encumbrance exists, unless at the time such property is so acquired a sufficient sum of money is to be deposited in trust to pay and redeem the fair value of such lien or encumbrance;

(4) To appoint, select, and employ officers, agents, and employees, including engineering, architectural, and construction experts, fiscal agents, and attorneys, and to fix their respective compensations;

(5) To execute contracts, leases, agreements, and instruments necessary or convenient in connection with the acquisition, construction, addition, extension, improvement, equipping, operation, or maintenance of a project, and any and all persons, firms, and corporations, Heard County, Georgia, the Heard County School District, and any other political subdivision or municipality of the State of Georgia located in Heard County, Georgia, are hereby authorized to enter into contracts, leases, agreements, or instruments with the authority upon such terms and for such purposes as they deem advisable and as they are authorized by law;

(6) To acquire, construct, add to, extend, improve, equip, operate, and maintain projects;

(7) To pay the costs of the project with the proceeds of revenue bonds or other obligations issued by the authority, from any grant or contribution from the United States

1 of America or any agency or instrumentality thereof, from the state or any agency or
 2 instrumentality or other political subdivision thereof, or from any other source
 3 whatsoever;

4 (8) To accept loans or grants or loans and grants of money or materials or property of
 5 any kind from the United States of America or any agency or instrumentality thereof,
 6 upon such terms and conditions as the United States of America or such agency or
 7 instrumentality may require;

8 (9) To accept loans or grants or loans and grants of money or materials or property of
 9 any kind from the state or any agency, instrumentality, or political subdivision thereof,
 10 upon such terms and conditions as the state or such agency, instrumentality, or political
 11 subdivision may require;

12 (10) To borrow money for any of its corporate purposes; to execute promissory notes;
 13 to issue revenue bonds; and to provide for the payment of its designations for borrowed
 14 money and for the rights of the holders thereof;

15 (11) To exercise any power usually possessed by private corporations performing similar
 16 functions, including the power to incur short-term debt and to approve, execute, and
 17 deliver appropriate evidence of any such indebtedness; and

18 (12) To do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers expressly given in
 19 this Act.

20 **SECTION 5.**

21 Revenue bonds.

22 The authority, or any authority or body which has or which may in the future succeed to the
 23 powers, duties, and liabilities vested in the authority created hereby, shall have the power and
 24 is hereby authorized to provide by resolution for the issuance of revenue bonds of the
 25 authority for the purpose of paying all or any part of the costs of the project and for the
 26 purpose of refunding revenue bonds or other obligations previously issued. The principal of
 27 and interest on such revenue bonds shall be payable solely from the special fund hereby
 28 provided for such payment. The revenue bonds of each issue shall be dated, shall bear
 29 interest at such rate or rates per annum, payable at such time or times, shall mature at such
 30 time or times not exceeding 40 years from their date or dates, shall be payable in such
 31 medium of payment as to both principal and interest as may be determined by the authority
 32 and may be redeemable before maturity, at the option of the authority, at such price or prices
 33 and under such terms and conditions as may be fixed by the authority in the resolution for
 34 the issuance of such revenue bonds.

SECTION 9.

Same; sale; price; proceeds.

The authority may sell revenue bonds in such manner and for such price as it may determine to be in the best interest of the authority. The proceeds derived from the sale of revenue bonds shall be used solely for the purpose or purposes provided in the resolutions and proceedings authorizing the issuance of such revenue bonds.

SECTION 10.

Same; interim receipts and certificates or temporary bonds.

Prior to the preparation of any definitive revenue bonds, the authority may, under like restrictions, issue interim receipts, interim certificates, or temporary revenue bonds, with or without coupons, exchangeable for definitive revenue bonds upon the issuance of the latter.

SECTION 11.

Same; replacement of lost or mutilated bonds.

The authority may provide for the replacement of any revenue bonds or coupons which shall become mutilated or be destroyed or lost.

SECTION 12.

Same; conditions precedent to issuance.

The authority shall adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance of the revenue bonds. In the resolution, the authority shall determine that the project financed with the proceeds of the revenue bonds is self-liquidating. Revenue bonds may be issued without any other proceedings or the happening of any other conditions or things other than those proceedings, conditions, and things which are specified or required by this Act. Any resolution providing for the issuance of revenue bonds under the provisions of this Act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and need not be published or posted, and any such resolution may be passed at any regular or special or adjourned meeting of the authority by a majority of its members.

SECTION 13.

Credit not pledged.

Revenue bonds shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of Heard County, Georgia; the City of Franklin; or the Heard County School District, nor a pledge of the faith and credit of said county, city, or school district but such revenue bonds shall be payable solely from the fund provided for in this Act. The issuance of such revenue bonds shall not directly, indirectly, or contingently obligate said county, city, or school district to levy or to pledge any form of taxation whatsoever for payment of such revenue bonds or to make any appropriation for their payment, and all such revenue bonds shall contain recitals on their face covering substantially the provisions of this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, this Act shall not affect the ability of the authority and said county, city, or school district to enter into an intergovernmental contract pursuant to which said county, city, or school district agrees to pay amounts sufficient to pay operating charges and other costs of the authority or any project including, without limitation, the principal of and interest on revenue bonds in consideration for services or facilities of the authority.

SECTION 14.

Trust indenture as security.

In the discretion of the authority, any issuance of revenue bonds may be secured by a trust indenture by and between the authority and a corporate trustee, which may be any trust company or bank having the powers of a trust company within or outside the state. Either the resolution providing for the issuance of the revenue bonds or such trust indenture may contain such provisions for protecting and enforcing the rights and remedies of the bondholders as may be reasonable and proper and not in violation of law, including covenants setting forth the duties of the authority in relation to the acquisition and construction of the project, the maintenance, operation, repair, and insuring of the project, and the custody, safeguarding, and application of all moneys.

SECTION 15.

To whom proceeds of bonds shall be paid.

In the resolution providing for the issuance of revenue bonds or in the trust indenture, the authority shall provide for the payment of the proceeds of the sale of the revenue bonds to any officer or person who, or any agency, bank, or trust company which, shall act as trustee

1 of such funds and shall hold and apply the same to the purposes thereof, subject to such
2 regulations as this Act and such resolution or trust indenture may provide.

3 **SECTION 16.**

4 Sinking fund.

5 The moneys received pursuant to an intergovernmental contract and the revenues, fees, tolls,
6 fines, charges, and earnings derived from any particular project or projects, regardless of
7 whether or not such revenues, fees, tolls, fines, charges, and earnings were produced by a
8 particular project for which revenue bonds have been issued, unless otherwise pledged and
9 allocated, may be pledged and allocated by the authority to the payment of the principal and
10 interest on revenue bonds of the authority as the resolution authorizing the issuance of the
11 revenue bonds or in the trust indenture may provide, and such funds so pledged from
12 whatever source received shall be set aside at regular intervals, as may be provided in the
13 resolution or trust indenture, into a sinking fund, which said sinking fund shall be pledged
14 to and charged with the payment of:

- 15 (1) The interest upon such revenue bonds as such interest shall fall due;
16 (2) The principal or purchase price of such revenue bonds as the same shall fall due;
17 (3) Any premium upon such revenue bonds as the same shall fall due;
18 (4) The purchase of such revenue bonds in the open market; and
19 (5) The necessary charges of the paying agent for paying principal and interest.

20 The use and disposition of such sinking fund shall be subject to such regulations as may be
21 provided in the resolution authorizing the issuance of the revenue bonds or in the trust
22 indenture, but, except as may otherwise be provided in such resolution or trust indenture,
23 such sinking fund shall be maintained as a trust account for the benefit of all revenue bonds
24 without distinction or priority of one over another.

25 **SECTION 17.**

26 Remedies of bondholders.

27 Any holder of revenue bonds or any of the coupons appertaining thereto, and the trustee
28 under the trust indenture, if any, except to the extent the rights herein given may be restricted
29 by resolution passed before the issuance of the revenue bonds or by the trust indenture, may,
30 either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus, or other proceedings, protect and
31 enforce any and all rights under the laws of the state, including specifically but without
32 limitation the Revenue Bond Law, or granted hereunder or under such resolution or trust
33 indenture, and may enforce and compel performance of all duties required by this Act or by

1 such resolution or trust indenture to be performed by the authority or any officer thereof,
2 including the fixing, charging, and collecting of revenues, fees, tolls, fines, and other charges
3 for the use of the facilities and services furnished.

4 **SECTION 18.**

5 Validation.

6 Revenue bonds and the security therefor shall be confirmed and validated in accordance with
7 the procedure of the Revenue Bond Law. The petition for validation shall also make party
8 defendant to such action the state, and any institution, department, or other agency thereof,
9 and any county, municipality, school district, or other political subdivision or authority of the
10 state which has contracted with the authority for services or facilities relating to the project
11 for which revenue bonds are to be issued and sought to be validated, and such defendant shall
12 be required to show cause, if any exists, why such contract or contracts shall not be
13 adjudicated as a part of the basis for the security for the payment of any such revenue bonds.
14 The revenue bonds, when validated, and the judgment of validation shall be final and
15 conclusive with respect to such revenue bonds and the security for the payment thereof and
16 interest thereon and against the authority and all other defendants.

17 **SECTION 19.**

18 Venue and jurisdiction.

19 Any action to protect or enforce any rights under the provisions of this Act or any suit or
20 action against such authority shall be brought in the Superior Court of Heard County,
21 Georgia, and any action pertaining to validation of any revenue bonds issued under the
22 provisions of this Act shall likewise be brought in said court which shall have exclusive,
23 original jurisdiction of such actions.

24 **SECTION 20.**

25 Interest of bondholders protected.

26 While any of the revenue bonds issued by the authority remain outstanding, the powers,
27 duties, or existence of said authority or its officers, employees, or agents shall not be
28 diminished or impaired in any manner that will affect adversely the interests and rights of the
29 holders of such revenue bonds, and no other entity, department, agency, or authority will be
30 created which will compete with the authority to such an extent as to affect adversely the
31 interest and rights of the holders of such revenue bonds, nor will the state itself so compete

1 with the authority. The provisions of this Act shall be for the benefit of the authority and the
2 holders of any such revenue bonds, and upon the issuance of such revenue bonds under the
3 provisions hereof, shall constitute a contract with the holders of such revenue bonds.

4 **SECTION 21.**

5 Moneys received considered trust funds.

6 All moneys received pursuant to the authority of this Act, whether as proceeds from the sale
7 of revenue bonds, as grants or other contributions, or as revenue, income, fees, and earnings,
8 shall be deemed to be trust funds to be held and applied solely as provided in this Act.

9 **SECTION 22.**

10 Purpose of the authority.

11 Without limiting the generality of any provision of this Act, the general purpose of the
12 authority is declared to be that of providing buildings, facilities, and services for the citizens
13 in Heard County, Georgia.

14 **SECTION 23.**

15 Rates, charges, and revenues; use.

16 The authority is hereby authorized to prescribe and fix rates and to revise same from time to
17 time and to collect revenues, tolls, fees, and charges for the services, facilities, and
18 commodities furnished, and in anticipation of the collection of the revenues, to issue revenue
19 bonds or other types of obligations as provided in this Act to finance, in whole or in part, the
20 costs of the project, and to pledge to the punctual payment of said revenue bonds or other
21 obligations all or any part of the revenues.

22 **SECTION 24.**

23 Rules, regulations, service policies, and procedures for operation of projects.

24 It shall be the duty of the authority to prescribe rules, regulations, service policies, and
25 procedures for the operation of any project or projects constructed or acquired under the
26 provisions of this Act. The authority may adopt bylaws.

SECTION 25.

Tort immunity.

To the extent permitted by law, the authority shall have the same immunity and exemption from liability for torts and negligence as Heard County, Georgia; and the officers, agents, and employees of the authority when in the performance of the work of the authority shall have the same immunity and exemption from liability for torts and negligence as the officers, agents, and employees of Heard County, Georgia, when in the performance of their public duties or work of the county.

SECTION 26.

Tax-exempt status of authority.

The properties of the authority, both real and personal, are declared to be public properties used for the benefit and welfare of the people of the state and not for purposes of private or corporate benefit and income, and such properties and the authority shall be exempt from all taxes and special assessments of any municipality, county, or the state and any political subdivision thereof.

SECTION 27.

Effect on other governments.

This Act shall not and does not in any way take from Heard County, Georgia, or any political subdivision or municipality the authorization to own, operate, and maintain public facilities or to issue revenue bonds as provided by the Revenue Bond Law.

SECTION 28.

Liberal construction of Act.

This Act, being for the welfare of various political subdivisions of the state and its inhabitants, shall be liberally construed to effect the purposes hereof.

SECTION 29.

Effect of partial invalidity of Act.

1 The provisions of this Act are severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held
2 unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the decision of such court shall not
3 affect or impair any of the remaining provisions.

4 **SECTION 30.**

5 Effective date.

6 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
7 without such approval.

8 **SECTION 31.**

9 General repealer.

10 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
