

**WITHDRAWN**

1 Senators Stokes of the 43rd, Brown of the 26th and Henson of the 41st offered the following  
2 amendment:

3 Amend SB 392 by inserting immediately before "to repeal conflicting laws" in the title the  
4 following:

5 "to amend Article 27 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
6 relating to loitering at or disrupting schools, so as to provide that each local board of  
7 education shall establish a violent incident reporting system for schools within the local  
8 system; to provide for an annual report of violent incidents to parents;".

9 By adding immediately preceding the last section thereof the following:

10 **"SECTION A.**

11 Article 27 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
12 loitering at or disrupting schools, is amended by inserting immediately following Code  
13 Section 20-2-1184 a new Code Section 20-2-1184.1 to read as follows:

14 '20-2-1184.1.

15 (a) Each local board of education shall establish a violent incident reporting system which  
16 each school within the local system shall adopt and enact.

17 (b) The violent incident reporting system established pursuant to subsection (a) of this  
18 Code section shall require the administrators of each public school to issue in an annual  
19 report to the parents of the students enrolled in the school, in a form and by a date  
20 prescribed by the local board of education, the following information concerning the  
21 commission by a student of any act prohibited by Code Section 20-2-1184:

22 (1) The type of offense;

23 (2) The age and grade of the student;

24 (3) The location at which the incident occurred;

25 (4) The type of incident;

26 (5) Whether the incident occurred during or outside of regular school hours;

27 (6) Where the incident involves a weapon, whether the weapon was a firearm, knife, or  
28 other weapon;

29 (7) The actions taken by the school in response to the incident, including when the  
30 incident was reported to law enforcement officials and whether disciplinary action was  
31 taken against the offenders;

- 1 (8) Any student discipline or referral action taken against the offender, including but not  
2 limited to an out-of-school suspension, an involuntary transfer to an alternative  
3 placement, an in-school suspension, a referral for community service, a referral for  
4 counseling, or a referral to the juvenile justice system and the duration of such action; and  
5 (9) The nature of the victim and the victim's age and grade where appropriate."
