- 2 WHEREAS, James Robert DeRoth of Troop 534 has attained the rank of Eagle Scout, the
3 most distinguished rank conferred by the Boy Scouts of America; and
- 4 WHEREAS, since 1911, the Eagle Scout Award has been the symbol of the highest and most
5 prestigious achievement among the Boy Scouts of America; and

7 rigorous program of training and demonstrate his proficiency in selected scouting techniques

11 of immense benefit throughout his life; and
- 12 WHEREAS, only two of every 100 boys who join Cub Scouts achieve the rank of Eagle
13 Scout; and
- 14 WHEREAS, this outstanding young man has truly exhibited a commitment to the scouting
15 principles of honesty and fairness and has consistently conducted himself in a manner
16 becoming an Eagle Scout; and
- 17 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper for this body to recognize the outstanding
18 accomplishments of this extraordinary young man.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
20 the members of this body commend and congratulate James Robert DeRoth on achieving the
21 rank of Eagle Scout.
