A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the director of the Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural
- 2 Resources to revoke forthwith the ground-water withdrawal permit held by the bankrupt
- 3 Durango Georgia Paper Company for its idle plant in St. Marys and to consider lifting the
- 4 moratorium on the issuance of new ground-water withdrawal permits in the 24 county area
- 5 in the Atlantic coastal and southeastern region of this state based upon the results of scientific
- 6 investigation of the condition of ground-water resources in that area; and for other purposes.
- 7 WHEREAS, the Durango Georgia Paper Company holds a ground-water withdrawal permit
- 8 issued by the Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources,
- 9 authorizing withdrawal of 44.5 million gallons per day for the company's plant in St. Marys;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, in comparison, the city of Brunswick used 5.2 million gallons per day in 2001;
- 12 and
- WHEREAS, the Durango Georgia Paper Company is bankrupt, its St. Marys plant is idle,
- and no ground water is being withdrawn under the permit for such plant; and
- 15 WHEREAS, a 24 county area in the Atlantic coastal and southeastern region of this state is
- 16 currently under a moratorium for the issuance of new ground-water withdrawal permits
- 17 established by the Environmental Protection Division; and
- 18 WHEREAS, this moratorium is a barrier to economic development in the affected area; and
- 19 WHEREAS, revocation of the ground-water withdrawal permit for the bankrupt Durango
- 20 Georgia Company's idle plant at St. Marys, along with a scientific investigation of the
- 21 condition of ground-water resources in the 24 county area in the Atlantic coastal and
- southeastern region of this state that is currently under a moratorium for the issuance of new

1 ground-water withdrawal permits, may allow the lifting of such moratorium and removal of

- 2 a substantial barrier to economic development.
- 3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 4 the members of this body urge the director of the Environmental Protection Division of the
- 5 Department of Natural Resources to revoke forthwith the ground-water withdrawal permit
- 6 held by the bankrupt Durango Georgia Paper Company for its idle plant in St. Marys and to
- 7 consider lifting the moratorium on the issuance of new ground-water withdrawal permits in
- 8 the 24 county area in the Atlantic coastal and southeastern region of this state based upon the
- 9 results of scientific investigation of the condition of ground-water resources in that area.
- 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the director of the
- 12 Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources.
