## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring and remembering the life of Christopher Jamall Moody; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, DeKalb County and the State of Georgia have lost one of their brightest and  
3 most promising young persons with the tragic passing of Christopher Jamall Moody on  
4 March 21, 2004; and
- 5 WHEREAS, he was born January 8, 1987, in DeKalb County, Georgia, to his loving parents  
6 Penny and Donald Moody; and
- 7 WHEREAS, he was a gifted and diligent student attending Redan High School and had  
8 distinguished himself as a standout among his peers with a grade point average of 3.7; and
- 9 WHEREAS, as an A-B Honor Roll student, he had dedicated himself to his goal of becoming  
10 a scientist and held an astounding 105 average in his chemistry class; and
- 11 WHEREAS, he was an energetic, outgoing, and positive young man who enjoyed spending  
12 time with family and friends, playing basketball in his local church league, and being a  
13 member of his high school track team; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Christopher was a member of the Upward Bound program hosted at Morehouse  
15 College, was a peer helper and mentor at Redan High School, and, since middle school, had  
16 been a faithful member of his school's bands; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he is survived by his parents, Penny and Donald Moody; brothers, Rashard,  
18 Nicholis, Nickshard, Chrishard, and Jamell; and grandparents, Mrs. Emma Moody, Mr. and  
19 Mrs. Charlie Howell, and Mr. Samuel McDavid.

2 honor and remember the life of Christopher Jamall Moody and extend to his family their  
3 deepest condolences for their tragic loss.
