

## House Resolution 1813

## A RESOLUTION

1 Commending and recognizing the City of Chamblee, its citizens, and the Chamblee  
2 Community Wildlife Habitat Committee; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia is dedicated to the preservation of its rich natural resources  
4 and beauty; and

5 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia recognizes the efforts of Chamblee's citizens, students, and  
6 teachers for their wildlife conservation efforts; and

7 WHEREAS, Chamblee resident and Master Gardener Kay Packard spearheaded the effort  
8 to certify the city's flourishing wildlife habitats by coordinating community efforts in order  
9 to provide the four essential elements for the preservation of wildlife: food, water, shelter,  
10 and places to raise young; and

11 WHEREAS, the Chamblee Community Wildlife Habitat provides an oasis for diverse flora  
12 and fauna including local and migratory birds, butterflies, insect pollinators, mammals, and  
13 native plants; and

14 WHEREAS, on June 3, 2003, the city was recognized by the National Wildlife Federation  
15 as one of only five Community Wildlife Habitat projects in the nation.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
17 the members of this body commend and recognize the City of Chamblee, its citizens, and the  
18 Chamblee Community Wildlife Habitat Committee's noble efforts in wildlife conservation  
19 and in creating a community where both people and wildlife can flourish.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
21 and directed to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the City of Chamblee and the  
22 Chamblee Community Wildlife Habitat Committee.
