15 WHEREAS, he was the former president of the Claxton Shrine Club, a distinguished
16 member of Ezel Lodge #335, the Reidsville Grand Rascals, and the Seaboard Hunting Club,
17 and a board member of the Sapelo Salt Water Fishing Club; and

18 WHEREAS, Mr. Rogers is survived by his loving wife, Wanda O. Rogers; sons, Grady Mack
19 Rogers III and Kendall Turner; daughters, Tammy Rogers, Rose Marie Morris, and Tracie
20 Durrence; and 13 glorious grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
