## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide a homestead exemption from Randolph County school district ad valorem taxes
- 2 for educational purposes for certain residents of that school district who are senior citizens;
- 3 to provide for definitions; to specify the terms and conditions of the exemption and the
- 4 procedures relating thereto; to provide for applicability; to provide for a referendum,
- 5 effective dates, and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

8 (a) As used in this Act, the term:

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- 9 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
- educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Randolph County school district,
- including, but not limited to, ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county
- school district bonded indebtedness.
- 13 (2) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
- the O.C.G.A., as amended, with the additional qualification that it shall include only the
- primary residence and not more than five contiguous acres of land immediately
- surrounding such residence.
- 17 (3) "Senior citizen" means a person who is 66 years of age or over on or before January
- 18 1 of the year in which application for the exemption under this Act is made.
- 19 (b) Each resident of the Randolph County school district who is a senior citizen is granted
- an exemption on that person's homestead from all Randolph County school district ad
- 21 valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of the full value of that homestead.
- 22 (c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this
- 23 section unless the person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner of
- 24 Randolph County giving the person's age and such additional information relative to
- 25 receiving such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner to make a determination

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1 regarding the initial and continuing eligibility of such owner for such exemption. The tax

- 2 commissioner shall provide application forms for this purpose.
- 3 (d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of
- 4 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year
- 5 as long as the owner occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the
- 6 proper application as provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to
- 7 make application thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to
- 8 such person. It shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under this
- 9 Act to notify the tax commissioner of Randolph County in the event that person for any
- 10 reason becomes ineligible for that exemption.
- 11 (e) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect any
- state ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, municipal ad valorem
- 13 taxes for municipal purposes, or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational
- 14 purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in lieu
- of and not in addition to any other homestead exemption applicable to Randolph County
- school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes.
- 17 (f) The exemption granted by this Act shall apply to all taxable years beginning on or after
- 18 January 1, 2005.

19 SECTION 2.

- 20 Unless prohibited by the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, the election
- 21 superintendent of Randolph County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this
- section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Randolph County school
- 23 district for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on
- 24 the date of the general election in November, 2004, and shall issue the call and conduct that
- 25 election as provided by general law. The superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of
- 26 the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date
- 27 thereof in the official organ of Randolph County. The ballot shall have written or printed
- 28 thereon the words:
- 29 "( ) YES Shall the Act be approved which provides a homestead exemption from
- Randolph County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes
- 31 ( ) NO for the full value of the homestead for residents of that school district who
- are 66 years of age or over?"
- 33 All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and those persons
- 34 desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes
- 35 cast on such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full
- 36 force and effect on January 1, 2005. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not

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1 conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective and

- 2 this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following
- 3 that election date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Randolph County. It shall
- 4 be the election superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.

## 5 SECTION 3.

- 6 Except as otherwise provided in Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
- 7 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

## 8 SECTION 4.

9 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
