## House Bill 1526 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Chapter 12 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2	control of hazardous conditions, so as to expand the childhood vaccination registry to include
3	vaccination on all persons from birth through death; to provide for related matters; to provide
4	an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
6	SECTION 1.
7	Chapter 12 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to control of
8	hazardous conditions, is amended by striking Code Section 31-12-3.1, relating to childhood
9	vaccination registry, reporting requirements, maintenance, and use, and inserting in lieu
10	thereof the following:
11	″31-12-3.1.
12	(a) The department, for purposes of establishing and maintaining a single repository of
13	accurate, complete, and current vaccination records to be used in aiding, coordinating, and
14	promoting effective and cost-efficient childhood disease prevention and control efforts,
15	shall establish and maintain a childhood vaccination registry.
16	(b) Any person who administers a vaccine or vaccines licensed for use in children by the
17	United States Food and Drug Administration to a child under the age of 18 person shall for
18	each such vaccination provide to the department such data as are deemed by the department
19	to be necessary and appropriate for purposes of the vaccination registry established
20	pursuant to subsection (a) of this Code section, including, without limitation:
21	(1) The name of the child person;
22	(2) The child's person's date and place of birth, including the name of the hospital where
23	delivered, if applicable;
24	(3) The names and addresses of the child's person's parents or guardians if the person
25	is 18 years of age or younger;

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(4) The date of the vaccination and the specific type or types of vaccine or vaccines administered to the child person on that date; and

3 (5) Complications or side effects resulting from a vaccination, if any.

Vaccination data reporting requirements, including without limitation the types of data
required to be reported and the time and manner of reporting such data, shall begin after
the registry has established linkages to vaccine providers and shall be established by the
department in consultation with the United States Centers for Disease Control and
Prevention, the Georgia chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the Georgia
Academy of Family Physicians.

(c) The department shall utilize the registry to provide notices, whether by mail, telephone,
personal contact, or other means, to <u>persons and to</u> parents or guardians regarding their
children or wards who are due or overdue for a particular type of vaccination according to
recommended vaccination schedules. The department shall consult with medical services
providers to determine the most effective and efficient manner of using the registry to
provide such notices.

(d) Vaccination records for any child <u>person</u> included within the vaccination registry shall
be maintained as part of the registry until the child reaches the age of 18 person's death.

18 (e) Individually identifiable vaccination information regarding a child person may be 19 provided to the department by, or released by the department to, a local health department, 20 hospital, physician, or other provider of medical services to the child person or to a school 21 or child care facility in which the child person is enrolled if the person is 18 years of age 22 or younger without the consent of the child's person or the person's parents or guardians. 23 All children persons shall be enrolled unless a specific exemption is requested by the 24 child's person or the person's parent or guardian if the person is 18 years of age or 25 younger. A parent or guardian may obtain and upon request to the department shall be 26 provided with all individually identifiable vaccination registry information regarding his 27 or her child or ward. Except as provided otherwise by this Code section, individually identifiable vaccination registry information shall be treated as confidential and shall not 28 29 be released to a third party without consent of a child's the person or the person's parent or guardian if the person is 18 years of age or younger. 30

31 (f) Nothing in this Code section shall:

(1) Prohibit the department from providing or publishing registry information in
aggregate form for scientific, educational, or public health purposes, provided that such
information is published without releasing or identifying individual names contained in
the registry;

36 (2) Prohibit the department or any medical services provider from notifying a <u>person or</u>
 37 <u>the person's parent</u>, or guardian <u>if the person is 18 years of age or younger</u>, or child of

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- 1 the child's person's vaccination status or of a vaccination that is due or overdue according
- 2 to recommended vaccination schedules; or
- 3 (3) Diminish a parent's or guardian's responsibility for having a child vaccinated
  4 properly.
- (g) Any person, including but not limited to practitioners of the healing arts, submitting
  or obtaining in good faith vaccination reports or data to or from the department in
  compliance with the provisions of this Code section and any rules or regulations
  promulgated pursuant to this Code section shall not be liable for any civil damages
  therefor.
- 10 (h) The department is authorized to accept any grants, gifts, awards, and funds from
- 11 government, public, and private sources to supplement any appropriation made for the
- 12 purpose of funding the provisions of this Code section.
- 13 (i) The department is authorized and directed to promulgate such rules and regulations as
- 14 are necessary and appropriate to implement the provisions of this Code section."
- 15 **SECTION 2.**
- 16 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2004.

## 17 **SECTION 3.**

18 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
