- 4 WHEREAS, a scholarly woman, she was a product of Walton County's public schools and
5 a graduate of Clark College in Atlanta; and
- 6 WHEREAS, on December 21, 1967, she married the love of her life, Mr. Roy Williams, and
7 together shared a love for five blessed children; and
- 8 WHEREAS, she was a devoted teacher serving in the Fulton County and Newton County
9 school systems; and
- 10 WHEREAS, a noted, respected, and admired civil rights advocate, Sarah Williams was a
11 former president of the Rockdale County chapter of the National Association for the
12 Advancement of Colored People and fought for the betterment of her community and the
13 State of Georgia; and
- 14 WHEREAS, she faithfully served on the Rockdale County Board of Health; and
- 15 WHEREAS, she was a compassionate and caring foster parent, giving safety, security, and
16 shelter to 30 foster children; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Sarah was a sweet and outgoing woman with a kind and generous spirit; and
- 18 WHEREAS, she is survived by her husband of 36 years, Roy Williams; daughters, Cathy
19 Williams, Charla Williams, Carissa "Bre" Williams; son, Rodrick Williams; and three
20 glorious grandchildren.
