A RESOLUTION

- 1 Declaring August 30, 2004, as David Bushnell Day in Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, David Bushnell was born on August 30, 1740, in Saybrook, Connecticut, and
- 3 attended Yale College; and
- 4 WHEREAS, while studying at Yale, David Bushnell invented a method of exploding timed
- 5 charges of gunpowder underwater and hoped to use his invention to challenge the British
- 6 ships blockading the harbors of the American colonies during the Revolutionary War; and
- 7 WHEREAS, in order to deliver his mine to the blockading ships, David Bushnell created the
- 8 Turtle, a one-person, human-powered craft capable of underwater navigation with the
- 9 assistance of the government of the State of Connecticut, the Continental Congress, George
- 10 Washington, Thomas Jefferson, and Benjamin Franklin; and
- 11 WHEREAS, on September 6, 1776, the Turtle, piloted by Continental Army Sgt. Ezra Lee,
- 12 navigated New York Harbor and attacked the flagship of the British blockade, the HMS
- 13 Eagle; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the Turtle was spotted by British sailors and Sgt. Lee was unable to attach the
- 15 mine to the HMS Eagle, but the mine detonated near the ship and so unnerved the British that
- 16 the blockade was repositioned further from shore, thereby reducing its effectiveness; and
- WHEREAS, this is recognized as the first use of a submarine in combat, nearly 100 years
- 18 before the successful attack by the Confederate submarine Hunley which became the first
- 19 submarine to sink another vessel in war; and
- 20 WHEREAS, David Bushnell was later appointed by General Washington to the Corps of
- 21 Miners and Sappers, the predecessor to the United States Army Corps of Engineers; and

1 WHEREAS, after the Revolutionary War ended, David Bushnell's friend and former Yale

- 2 student Abraham Baldwin, who founded the University of Georgia, convinced Bushnell to
- 3 move to Georgia; and
- 4 WHEREAS, under the assumed name of David Bush, Bushnell opened a private academy,
- 5 became a physician, and lived the remaining 30 years of his life in what was then Columbia
- 6 County, Georgia; and
- 7 WHEREAS, David Bushnell died in 1824 at the age of 84 and is buried in what is now
- 8 Warrenton, Georgia; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Rick and Laura Brown, graduates of the University of Georgia and now
- 10 professors at the Massachusetts College of Art, have constructed a replica of the Turtle which
- will be exhibited in Georgia this year; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the accomplishments of this remarkable individual are worthy of recognition
- 13 and study.
- 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that August 30, 2004, is
- 15 hereby declared to be David Bushnell Day in Georgia.
