## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide a homestead exemption from Clay County school district ad valorem taxes for
- 2 educational purposes for the full value of the homestead for residents of that school district
- 3 who are 62 years of age or older; to provide for definitions; to specify the terms and
- 4 conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for applicability;
- 5 to provide for a referendum, effective dates, and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws;
- 6 and for other purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 (a) As used in this Act, the term:
- 10 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
- educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Clay County school district,
- including, but not limited to, ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire county
- school district bonded indebtedness.
- 14 (2) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
- the O.C.G.A., as amended, with the additional qualification that it shall include only the
- primary residence and not more than five contiguous acres of land immediately
- surrounding such residence.
- 18 (3) "Senior citizen" means a person who is 62 years of age or over on or before January
- 19 1 of the year in which application for the exemption under this Act is made.
- 20 (b) Each resident of the Clay County school district who is a senior citizen is granted an
- 21 exemption on that person's homestead from all Clay County school district ad valorem taxes
- 22 for educational purposes in the amount of the full value of that homestead.
- 23 (c) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this
- section unless the person or person's agent files an application with the tax commissioner of
- 25 Clay County giving the person's age and such additional information relative to receiving
- such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner to make a determination regarding the

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1 initial and continuing eligibility of such owner for such exemption. The tax commissioner

- 2 shall provide application forms for this purpose.
- 3 (d) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 of
- 4 the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year to year
- 5 as long as the owner occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the
- 6 proper application as provided in subsection (c) of this section, it shall not be necessary to
- 7 make application thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed to
- 8 such person. It shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under this
- 9 Act to notify the tax commissioner of Clay County in the event that person for any reason
- 10 becomes ineligible for that exemption.
- 11 (e) The exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall not apply to or affect any
- state ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, municipal ad valorem
- 13 taxes for municipal purposes, or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational
- 14 purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsection (b) of this section shall be in lieu
- of and not in addition to any other homestead exemption applicable to Clay County school
- 16 district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes.
- 17 (f) The exemption granted by this Act shall apply to all taxable years beginning on or after
- 18 January 1, 2005.

19 SECTION 2.

- 20 Unless prohibited by the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, the election
- 21 superintendent of Clay County shall call and conduct an election as provided in this section
- 22 for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Clay County school district for
- 23 approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on the date of
- 24 the general primary in 2004 and shall issue the call and conduct that election as provided by
- 25 general law. The superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to be
- 26 published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof in the official
- 27 organ of Clay County. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon the words:
- 28 "( ) YES Shall the Act be approved which provides a homestead exemption from
- 29 Clay County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes for
- 30 ( ) NO the full value of the homestead for residents of that school district who are
- 31 62 years of age or over?"
- 32 All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and those persons
- desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes
- cast on such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full
- 35 force and effect on January 1, 2005. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not
- 36 conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective and

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1 this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following

- 2 that election date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Clay County. It shall be
- 3 the election superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.

## 4 SECTION 3.

- 5 Except as otherwise provided in Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
- 6 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

## 7 SECTION 4.

8 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
