A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elections, so as to 2 correct typographical, stylistic, and other errors and omissions in Title 21 of the Official 3 Code of Georgia Annotated and in Acts of the General Assembly amending Title 21 of the 4 Official Code of Georgia Annotated; to correct capitalization and spelling in Title 21 of the 5 Official Code of Georgia Annotated; to provide for necessary or appropriate revisions and modernizations of matters contained in Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated; 6 7 to provide for other matters relating to Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated; 8 to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA: 10 **SECTION 1.**

11 Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elections, is amended as12 follows:

(1) By striking "provided in paragraph (1)" and inserting in its place "provided in
subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1)" in paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Code Section
21-2-131, relating to the fixing and publishing of qualification fees, manner of payment, and
distribution of fees in regard to the fees paid for party and public offices.

(2) By striking "pursuant to Code Section 21-2-417(b)" and inserting in its place "pursuant
to subsection (b) of Code Section 21-2-417" in subsection (b) of Code Section 21-2-225,
relating to the confidentiality of original registration applications, limitations on registration

20 data available for public inspection, and data made available by the Secretary of State in

- 21 regard to the registration of voters.
- 22 (3) By striking "Except that an elector" and inserting in its place "An elector" in subsection
- 23 (a) of Code Section 21-2-409, relating to assisting electors who cannot read English or who
- 24 have physical disabilities.

SECTION 2.

- 2 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 3 without such approval.
