

House Bill 242

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 14 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
2 relating to traffic-control signal monitoring devices, so as to change provisions regarding  
3 reports of use of such devices to elected officials; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other  
4 purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

7 Article 3 of Chapter 14 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
8 traffic-control signal monitoring devices, is amended by striking Code Section 40-14-24,  
9 relating to reporting of traffic-control signal monitoring device use to elected officials,  
10 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

11 "40-14-24.

12 Each county or municipality using any traffic-control signal monitoring device shall  
13 submit not later than February 1 of each year a report on such use during the preceding  
14 calendar year to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, ~~and~~ the Speaker of the House  
15 of Representatives, the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader of the Senate, the  
16 Majority Leader and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, and the  
17 chairpersons of the Senate Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Defense and the  
18 House Committee on Public Safety. Such report shall include, without limitation:

19 (1) A description of the locations where traffic-control signal monitoring devices  
20 were used;

21 (2) The number of violations recorded at each location and in the aggregate on a  
22 monthly basis;

23 (3) The total number of citations issued;

24 (4) The number of civil monetary penalties and total amount of such penalties paid  
25 after citation without contest;

26 (5) The number of violations adjudicated and results of such adjudications, including  
27 a breakdown of dispositions made;

- 1 (6) The total amount of civil monetary penalties paid; and
- 2 (7) The quality of the adjudication process and its results."

3 **SECTION 2.**

4 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
