A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending the Atlanta Belt Line project and urging the City of Atlanta and related parties
- 2 to move forward with the Belt Line project; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the Belt Line is a project to develop a 22 mile transit greenway within the City
- 4 of Atlanta using existing right of way rail lines; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the Belt Line would encircle over 40 of Atlanta's historic intown neighborhoods
- 6 that currently do not have sufficient access to rail transportation; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the Belt Line would act as a catalyst for redevelopment and revitalization of
- 8 these intown neighborhoods, as well as helping to preserve and enhance existing commercial
- 9 and residential areas; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the Belt Line would provide convenient alternative access to major destinations
- in Atlanta, such as Piedmont Hospital, the Atlanta Botanical Gardens, City Hall East, the
- 12 Carter Center, the King Center, Zoo Atlanta, West End, and the King Plow Arts Center; and
- WHEREAS, the Belt Line proposes to increase greenspace within the City of Atlanta by up
- 14 to 1,400 acres by expanding and creating park areas along the transit rights of way; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the Belt Line would be financed by federal grants and a local Tax Allocation
- 16 District, and would have no direct impact on the budget of the State of Georgia; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the Belt Line would connect with existing MARTA rail and bus lines to extend
- and enhance Atlanta's transportation infrastructure; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Atlanta currently ranks among the nation's worst cities for traffic, pollution, and
- 20 greenspace; and

1 WHEREAS, transportation alternatives are a necessary and needed part of future

- 2 management of traffic and pollution in metropolitan Atlanta; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the Belt Line would work to substantially reduce traffic and pollution and to
- 4 greatly increase greenspace within the City of Atlanta.
- 5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that this body recognizes and
- 6 commends the Belt Line project for its innovative approach to urban transportation and
- 7 greenspace.
- 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Atlanta and all related parties are urged to
- 9 continue to take proactive measures to see that the Belt Line will come to fruition.
- 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body commends former City Council of Atlanta
- 11 President Cathy Woolard for her work to bring the project before the public and commends
- 12 Ryan Gravel for his work originating the Belt Line concept while at Georgia Tech and for
- 13 his work on the project since then.
- 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 15 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the Mayor of Atlanta, to the City Council
- of Atlanta, to the Chairmen of the Belt Line Steering Committee, to Cathy Woolard, and to
- 17 Ryan Gravel.
