A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing Home Education Day at the Capitol; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the members of the House of Representatives are dedicated to excellence in
3 education; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the members of this body believe that the fundamental responsibility and right
5 to ensure the best quality education for their children and parental choice and involvement
6 are crucial to excellence in education; and
- 7 WHEREAS, home education has been a major part of America's education system since the
8 beginning of our nation and demonstrates the American ideals of liberty, innovation, and
9 individual responsibility; and
- 10 WHEREAS, many American statesmen and leaders, including George Washington, Patrick
11 Henry, John Quincy Adams, John Marshall, Robert E. Lee, Booker T. Washington, Thomas
12 Edison, Abraham Lincoln, Theodore Roosevelt, Woodrow Wilson, Mark Twain, and Andrew
13 Carnegie, were home schooled; and
- 14 WHEREAS, home schooled students continue to exhibit excellence in academic achievement
15 and perform well above the national average on standardized achievement tests; and
- 16 WHEREAS, home educated students in Georgia have continually exhibited high standards
17 of academic achievement and citizenship.
- 18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
19 the members of this body recognize the parents' right to choose the best education for their
20 children and that home education has proven to be a successful form of education.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Thursday, February 10, 2005, is acknowledged as Home
2 Education Day at the Capitol.

3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
4 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the public and the press.
