## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 18 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 treatment and rehabilitation of spinal cord disabled and head-injured persons, so as to create
- 3 a state-wide central registry for traumatic brain and spinal cord injuries; to change certain
- 4 definitions; to require that certain information relating to brain or spinal cord injured persons
- 5 be reported to the Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission; to provide for certain
- 6 duties of the commission; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 7 other purposes.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.** 

- 10 Chapter 18 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to treatment and
- 11 rehabilitation of spinal cord disabled and head-injured persons, is amended by striking said
- 12 chapter in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
- 13 "CHAPTER 18
- 14 31-18-1.
- 15 It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure the registration by the department of all
- spinal cord disabled or head-injured persons in order that all spinal cord disabled or
- 17 head-injured persons might obtain rehabilitative services provided by existing state
- agencies, departments, other organizations, and individuals. It is the intent of the General
- 19 <u>Assembly to create a state-wide Central Registry for Traumatic Brain and Spinal Injuries</u>
- 20 <u>to ensure the registration of all persons with traumatic brain or spinal cord injuries in order</u>
- 21 <u>that all such persons might obtain information about rehabilitative, independent living, and</u>
- 22 other services or goods provided by existing state agencies, departments, other
- 23 <u>organizations, and individuals.</u>

- 2 As used in this chapter, the term:
- 3 (1) 'Head-injured person' means a person who has sustained brain damage of traumatic 4 or acute onset, not of a degenerative nature, that results in temporary or permanent 5 decrease of cognitive, behavioral, social, or physical functioning. Brain injury means a 6 traumatic injury to the brain (cranio-cerebral head trauma), not of a degenerative or 7 congenital nature, but arising from blunt or penetrating trauma or from acceleration-deceleration forces, that is associated with any of these symptoms or signs 8 9 attributed to the injury: decreased level of consciousness, amnesia, other neurologic or 10 neuropsychologic abnormalities, skull fracture, or diagnosed intracranial lesions. These impairments may be either temporary or permanent and can result in a partial or total 11 12 functional disability.
  - (2) 'Spinal cord disabled person' means a person suffering from any spinal cord disease, spinal cord injury, or neural tube defect, whether congenital or acquired, which results in partial or total loss of motor or sensory functions and which results in partial or total disability, regardless of whether such disability is temporary or permanent. 'Spinal cord injury' means a traumatic injury to the spinal cord, not of a degenerative or congenital nature, but arising from blunt or penetrating trauma or from acceleration-deceleration forces, resulting in paraplegia or quadriplegia, which can be a partial or total loss of physical function.

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22 Except as otherwise provided, every public and private health and social agency and every physician authorized to practice medicine in this state shall report to the Brain and Spinal 23 24 Injury Trust Fund Commission, which is administratively assigned to the department, the 25 name of any person such agency or physician has identified as being spinal cord disabled or head-injured. The report shall be made within 48 hours after identification of the spinal 26 27 cord disabled or head-injured person. The report shall contain the name, age, address, type 28 and extent of disability, and such other information concerning the disabled person as the 29 Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission, which is administratively assigned to the 30 department, may require. Every public and private health and social agency, every hospital 31 or facility that has a valid permit or provisional permit issued by the Department of Human 32 Resources under Chapter 7 of this title, and every physician licensed to practice medicine in this state, if such physician has not otherwise reported such information to another 33 agency, hospital, and facility, shall report to the Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund 34 Commission such information concerning the identity of the person such agency, hospital, 35 36 facility, or physician has identified as having a traumatic brain or spinal cord injury as

defined in this chapter. The report shall be made within 45 days after identification of the

- 2 person with the traumatic brain or spinal cord injury. The report shall contain the name,
- 3 age, address, type and extent of disability, and such other information concerning the
- 4 person with the disability as the Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission, which
- 5 <u>is administratively assigned to the department, may require.</u>
- 6 31-18-4.
- 7 (a) The Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission, which is administratively
- 8 assigned to the department, shall establish procedures whereby a spinal cord disabled or
- 9 head-injured person for whom a report is made under this chapter shall be referred with
- 10 informed consent to appropriate public or private departments or agencies for treatment and
- 11 rehabilitative services. The Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission, which is
- 12 <u>administratively assigned to the Department of Human Resources, shall establish</u>
- 13 <u>procedures whereby a person with a traumatic brain or spinal cord injury for whom a report</u>
- is made in this chapter shall be informed of appropriate agencies, departments, hospitals,
- 15 <u>facilities, organizations, or individuals providing rehabilitative, independent living, and</u>
- other services or goods.
- 17 (b) The Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission shall maintain records of reports,
- 18 notifications, and referrals made under this chapter. The Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund
- 19 Commission shall produce an annual report relating to information and data collected
- 20 pursuant to this chapter and shall make such report available upon request. The Brain and
- 21 Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission shall maintain records of reports and notifications
- 22 made under this chapter. The Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund Commission shall
- 23 produce an annual report relating to information and data collected pursuant to this chapter
- 24 and shall make such report available upon request.
- 25 (c) Statistical information collected under this chapter shall be available to any other
- 26 federal or state agency or private organization concerned with spinal cord dysfunction or
- 27 head injuries, but no names or addresses will be provided without the consent of the spinal
- 28 cord disabled or head-injured person or the consent of the immediate family or guardian
- 29 of such person if that person is unable to consent. Statistical information collected under
- 30 this chapter shall be available to any other federal or state agency or private organization
- 31 concerned with traumatic brain or spinal cord injuries, but no names or addresses will be
- 32 provided without the consent of the person with the traumatic brain or spinal cord injury
- or the consent of the immediate family or guardian of such person if that person is unable
- 34 to consent."

1 SECTION 2.

2 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
