The House Committee on Health and Human Services offers the following substitute to HB 390:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 6 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state
- 2 health planning and development, so as to create a State Commission on the Efficacy of the
- 3 Certificate of Need Program; to provide for legislative intent; to provide for composition of
- 4 the commission and the commission's powers and duties; to provide for compensation of the
- 5 members of the commission; to provide for officers of the commission; to provide for a
- 6 quorum for the transaction of business; to provide for a final report; to provide for related
- 7 matters; to provide an effective date; to provide for automatic repeal on a certain date; to
- 8 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 11 Chapter 6 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state health
- 12 planning and development, is amended by adding a new Article 5 to read as follows:
- 13 "ARTICLE 5
- 14 31-6-90.
- 15 The General Assembly finds and declares that it is important to periodically assess various
- existing state programs to determine whether such programs continue to be viable and
- 17 effective or whether they have become obsolete and have failed to or ceased to accomplish
- their original policy objectives. The General Assembly further finds that access to quality
- 19 health care and the rising cost of such care are vitally important to the citizens of Georgia.
- Therefore, the General Assembly has determined that it is in the best interests of the state
- and its citizenry to undertake an evaluation of the certificate of need program.

- 2 There is created a State Commission on the Efficacy of the Certificate of Need Program
- 3 for the purpose of studying and collecting information and data relating to the effectiveness
- 4 of the certificate of need program in Georgia. The commission shall be responsible for
- 5 conducting a comprehensive review of the certificate of need program which shall include,
- 6 but not be limited to, the effectiveness of the program in accomplishing its original policy
- objectives, the costs associated with the program, and the impact on health care and costs
- 8 of continuing or discontinuing the program. Further, the commission shall undertake to
- 9 determine if changes to the program are needed in order to achieve its policy objectives.
- These changes include, but are not limited to, a determination as to whether services
- currently not subject to regulation should be regulated; whether services currently subject
- 12 to regulation should no longer be regulated; and whether the current statutory appeals
- procedure properly balances the competing goals of good decision making and timeliness,
- as well as whether or not it is subject to abuse.

- 16 (a) The State Commission on the Efficacy of the Certificate of Need Program shall be
- 17 composed of 11 members. The Governor shall appoint four members. The President Pro
- 18 Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each appoint
- 19 two members, as each deems advisable. The chairpersons of the Board of Community
- Health and the Health Strategies Council, and the Commissioner of the Department of
- 21 Community Health shall be ex officio members of the commission.
- 22 (b) The Governor shall designate the chairperson of the Board of Community Health or
- 23 the chairperson of the Health Strategies Council to serve as the chairperson of the
- 24 commission. The commission may elect other officers as deemed necessary. The
- chairperson of the commission may designate and appoint committees from among the
- 26 membership of the commission as well as appoint other persons to perform such functions
- as he or she may determine to be necessary as relevant to and consistent with this article.
- The chairperson shall only vote to break a tie.

- 30 (a) The commission shall hold meetings at the call of the chairperson.
- 31 (b) A quorum for transacting business shall be a majority of the members of the
- 32 commission.
- 33 (c) Any legislative members of the commission shall receive the allowances provided for
- in Code Section 28-1-8. Citizen members shall receive a daily expense allowance in the
- amount specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 as well as the mileage or

1 transportation allowance authorized for state employees. Any members of the commission 2 who are state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall receive 3 no compensation for their services on the commission, but they shall be reimbursed for 4 expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties as members of the 5 commission in the same manner as they are reimbursed for expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees. The funds necessary for the reimbursement of the expenses 6 of state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall come from 7 8 funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective departments. All other funds 9 necessary to carry out the provisions of this article shall come from funds appropriated to 10 the House of Representatives and the Senate.

- 12 (a) The commission shall have the following duties:
- 13 (1) To study and evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of Georgia's certificate of 14 need program and any other program or matter related to the cost and quality of health
- care in Georgia, as determined by the commission;
- 16 (2) To undertake a comprehensive review of the certificate of need program which shall
- include, but not be limited to, the effectiveness of the program in accomplishing its
- original policy objectives, the costs associated with the program, the benefits of
- 19 continuing or discontinuing the program, the financial impact of continuing or
- discontinuing the program, and the impact on the quality, availability, and cost of health
- 21 care if the program is continued or discontinued;
- 22 (3) To evaluate and consider the experiences and results in other states which utilize and
- which have abolished certificate of need programs;
- 24 (4) To identify findings and conclusions, including but not limited to recommendations
- as to whether the certificate of need program should be continued, discontinued, or
- 26 modified;
- 27 (5) To evaluate the impact of continuing or discontinuing the certificate of need on
- providing patient care in trauma care hospitals, critical access hospitals, and public
- 29 hospitals;
- 30 (6) To evaluate the impact of continuing or discontinuing the certificate of need program
- on providing service to Medicaid and indigent patients; and
- 32 (7) To make recommendations for proposed legislation.
- 33 (b) The commission shall have the following powers:
- 34 (1) To evaluate the certificate of need program in Georgia and any other program or
- matter relative to the cost and quality of health care in Georgia;
- 36 (2) To conduct a state-wide audit of the certificate of need program in Georgia;

1 (3) To request and receive data from and review the records of appropriate agencies and

- 2 health care facilities to the greatest extent allowed by state and federal law;
- 3 (4) To accept public or private grants, devises, and bequests;
- 4 (5) To enter into all contracts or agreements necessary or incidental to the performance
- 5 of its duties; and
- 6 (6) To conduct studies, collect data, or take any other action the commission deems
- 7 necessary to fulfill its responsibilities.
- 8 (c) The commission shall be authorized to retain the services of auditors, attorneys,
- 9 financial consultants, health care experts, economists, and other individuals or firms as
- determined appropriate by the commission.
- 11 (d) Staff support for the commission shall be provided by the Department of Community
- Health. The Department of Community Health may use any funds specifically appropriated
- to the department to support the work of the commission for such purpose.
- 14 (e) Prior to the final report required in subsection (f) of this Code Section, the commission
- may advise on legislation and on recommended changes to the regulations of the
- Department of Community Health to the Governor and the General Assembly.
- 17 (f) The commission shall issue a final report which shall include proposed legislation, if
- any, to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before June 30, 2007.

- The commission shall stand abolished and this article shall be repealed on June 30, 2007."
- 21 SECTION 2.
- 22 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 23 without such approval.
- SECTION 3.
- 25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
