A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 6 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions relative to services for the aging, so as to provide for the 2 3 development of a strategy for disseminating information to the public concerning the 4 availability of pharmaceutical assistance programs and pharmaceutical discount purchasing 5 card programs; to provide for the coordination of such dissemination of information through the Division of Aging Services of the Department of Human Resources; to provide for the 6 7 establishment and maintenance of a website and a toll-free telephone number for the 8 dissemination of information; to ensure that area agencies on aging receive adequate 9 information concerning the services; to provide for the encouragement of pharmaceutical 10 manufacturers to include user-friendly application forms for pharmaceutical discount purchasing card programs on their respective websites; to provide for an analysis of the 11 12 feasibility of developing a single application form for eligibility; to provide that the 13 commissioner may appoint an advisory task force; to provide for related matters; to repeal 14 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

16 SECTION 1.

- 17 Article 1 of Chapter 6 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 18 general provisions relative to services for the aging, is amended by adding a new Code
- 19 Section 49-6-8 to read as follows:
- 20 "49-6-8.

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- 21 (a) The commissioner of the Department of Human Resources and the director of the
- 22 Division of Aging Services shall develop a strategy, in coordination with the area agencies
- on aging, as defined in Code Section 49-6-72, and other private and nonprofit
- organizations, for disseminating information to the public concerning the availability of
- 25 pharmaceutical assistance programs and pharmaceutical discount purchasing card programs

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and for training senior citizen volunteers to assist in completing applications for pharmaceutical assistance programs and pharmaceutical discount purchasing cards.

- 3 (b) The department, through its Division of Aging Services, shall coordinate the
- 4 dissemination of information to the public regarding any pharmaceutical assistance
- 5 programs and any pharmaceutical discount purchasing card programs while maintaining
- 6 a neutral posture regarding such programs. The information shall include pharmaceutical
- benefits provided under the medicare program and how such benefits may help senior
- 8 citizens with the costs of pharmaceutical benefits.
- 9 (c) The department, through its Division of Aging Services, shall establish and maintain
- a website to provide for the dissemination of information pursuant to this Code section.
- 11 (d) The department, through its Division of Aging Services, shall establish and maintain
- 12 a toll-free telephone number which shall provide recorded information regarding
- 13 pharmaceutical assistance programs and pharmaceutical discount purchasing cards and
- 14 other services available through the division and other appropriate agencies or
- organizations.
- 16 (e) The department, through its Division of Aging Services, shall ensure that each area
- agency on aging is provided with adequate information concerning the services provided
- by and through the division, including, but not limited to, its toll-free telephone number and
- 19 website information on pharmaceutical assistance programs and pharmaceutical discount
- 20 purchasing card programs provided pursuant to this Code section.
- 21 (f)(1) The commissioner of the Department of Human Resources and the director of the
- Division of Aging Services shall encourage pharmaceutical manufacturers to include
- application forms for pharmaceutical discount purchasing card programs on their
- respective websites in a format capable of being downloaded and printed by consumers.
- 25 When practicable, the website maintained by the department shall include direct links to
- such forms.
- 27 (2) The commissioner of the Department of Human Resources and the director of the
- Division of Aging Services shall report to the Governor and the General Assembly no
- later than October 30, 2005, on the feasibility of developing a single application form for
- 30 citizens of this state to use to seek eligibility for existing pharmaceutical assistance
- 31 programs and pharmaceutical discount purchasing cards. In determining feasibility, the
- 32 commissioner and director shall obtain copies of the application forms used by such
- pharmaceutical assistance programs and pharmaceutical discount purchasing cards in this
- state, compile a list of the various information required to complete such application
- forms, identify common elements, and analyze the forms for readability and simplicity.
- 36 Upon completion of this analysis, the commissioner and director shall assess the
- feasibility of designing a single, concise application form that is logically formatted,

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1 written in clear and easily understandable language, and covers any and all data that may

- 2 be required to obtain eligibility for any such pharmaceutical assistance programs and
- 3 pharmaceutical discount purchasing cards.
- 4 (g) The commissioner may appoint an advisory task force of stakeholders to assist the
- department in meeting the requirements of subsections (a) and (f) of this Code section."

6 SECTION 2.

7 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
