A RESOLUTION

1 Commending George F. Barnhill on becoming an Eagle Scout; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, George F. Barnhill has earned the rank of Eagle Scout; and

4 WHEREAS, since 1911, the Eagle Scout Award has been the symbol of the highest and most
5 prestigious achievement among the Boy Scouts of America; and

6 WHEREAS, the attainment of Eagle Scout rank indicates that a Scout has developed
7 leadership ability, self-confidence, mature judgment, and mental and physical capabilities
8 that will be of immense benefit throughout life; and

9 WHEREAS, George F. Barnhill has amply demonstrated to his Scout leaders and peers that
10 he possesses these qualities along with sterling character; and

11 WHEREAS, for a Scout to reach Eagle rank, he must earn 21 merit badges, 12 of which are
12 mandatory requirements for the Eagle Scout program; and

13 WHEREAS, in achieving Eagle Scout status, George F. Barnhill has brought honor not only
14 to himself but also to his family and troop.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
16 recognize and commend George F. Barnhill for his diligence and dedication in pursuing the
17 highest honor awarded by the Boy Scouts of America and congratulate him on attaining the
