

## Senate Resolution 307

## A RESOLUTION

1 Commending The Links, Inc. and its Links Day at the Capitol; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, founded in 1946 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, The Links, Incorporated is a  
3 not-for-profit organization with 274 chapters nationwide comprised of more than 10,000  
4 women of color committed to enriching, sustaining, and ensuring the identities, culture, and  
5 economic survival of all people of African origin; and

6 WHEREAS, Links Day at the Capitol will take place on Friday, February 25, 2005, and is  
7 a project of the Southern Area of The Links, which consists of 2,500 members in 75 chapters  
8 throughout the South; and

9 WHEREAS, in each state throughout the South, The Links, Inc. is traveling to their  
10 respective capitals to ask for the elimination of health disparities among those most  
11 vulnerable; and

12 WHEREAS, Healthy People 2010 legislation is an initiative that promotes health objectives  
13 designed to identify the most significant preventable threats to health and will establish  
14 national goals to reduce these threats; and

15 WHEREAS, Healthy People 2010 concentrates on infant mortality, cancer, cardiovascular  
16 disease, diabetes, HIV infections/AIDS, and immunizations; and

17 WHEREAS, in Georgia, this much needed effort is being coordinated by the Magnolia  
18 Chapter of The Links and state project coordinator Dora McDonald.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that this body recognizes The  
20 Links, Inc. as an extremely valuable organization and commends its work to improve the  
21 lives of those who need the most assistance and to reduce the growing health disparities  
22 within our state.
