# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend an Act providing for the Board of Education of Wayne County, approved January
2	28, 1994 (Ga. L. 1994, p. 3512), as amended, so as to provide for the nonpartisan election
3	of members of that board; to provide for submission of this Act under the federal Voting
4	Rights Act of 1965, as amended; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and
5	for other purposes.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
7	SECTION 1.
8	An Act providing for the Board of Education of Wayne County, approved January 28, 1994
9	(Ga. L. 1994, p. 3512), as amended, is amended by striking subsection (f) of Section 1 and
10	inserting in lieu thereof the following:
11	"(f) All elections for members of the Board of Education of Wayne County conducted after
12	January 1, 2006, shall be nonpartisan elections as provided for in Code Section 21-2-139
13	of the O.C.G.A. Such nonpartisan elections shall be held in conjunction with the
14	November general election immediately preceding expiration of the term of office and
15	conducted as provided in Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the O.C.G.A., the 'Georgia Election
16	Code.' Those members of the board of education in office on January 1, 2006, shall serve
17	out the terms of office for which they were elected and shall be eligible to succeed
18	themselves as provided in this subsection."

#### **SECTION 2.**

The Board of Education of Wayne County shall through its legal counsel cause this Act to be submitted for preclearance under the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended; and such submission shall be made to the United States Department of Justice or filed with the appropriate court no later than 90 days after the date on which this Act is approved by the Governor or otherwise becomes law without such approval. 1

## **SECTION 3.**

- 2 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 3 without such approval.

5 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
