13 the Bacon County Board of Education; and

14 WHEREAS, he was a faithful and devoted husband to his wife, Mrs. Ida Mae Collins Linder,
15 with whom he raised five children, one daughter and four sons; and

16 WHEREAS, he was an ardent and steadfast advocate for children who helped to build a
17 strong community by inspiring others through his exemplary leadership, character, and
18 service.
