## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To provide for an alternate method of distribution of the net proceeds of the sales and use tax
- 2 for educational purposes authorized under Article VIII, Section VI, Paragraph IV of the
- 3 Constitution of the State of Georgia between the Montgomery County School District and
- 4 the City of Vidalia Independent School District located partially in Montgomery County; to
- 5 provide for the authority of this Act; to provide an effective date; to provide for automatic
- 6 repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 The net proceeds of the sales and use tax for educational purposes authorized under Article
- 10 VIII, Section VI, Paragraph IV of the Constitution of the State of Georgia shall be distributed
- between the Montgomery County School District and the City of Vidalia Independent School
- 12 District located partially in Montgomery County as follows:
- 13 (1) The Montgomery County School District shall receive 100 percent of the net
- proceeds; and
- 15 (2) The City of Vidalia Independent School District shall receive 0 percent of the net
- 16 proceeds.

17 SECTION 2.

- 18 This Act is enacted pursuant to the specific authority provided in Article VIII, Section VI,
- 19 Paragraph IV(g) of the Constitution of the State of Georgia.
- SECTION 3.
- 21 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 22 without such approval; provided, however, that unless a referendum for the approval of the
- 23 sales and use tax for educational purposes is conducted in 2005 in the Montgomery County
- 24 School District and the City of Vidalia Independent School District located partially in

1 Montgomery County and is approved by more than one-half of the votes cast on such

2 question, this Act shall be void and shall be automatically repealed on December 31, 2005.

## 3 SECTION 4.

4 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
