

Senate Resolution 431

A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Security for State and County Buildings; and for
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Superior Court Judge Rowland Barnes, a court reporter, and a deputy sheriff
4 were murdered and another deputy was shot at the Fulton County courthouse in downtown
5 Atlanta on March 11, 2005; and

6 WHEREAS, the husband and mother of a judge in another city were recently murdered; and

7 WHEREAS, these deaths and injuries are only part of an apparent increase in violence
8 against public officials; and

9 WHEREAS, new technology may be available to increase security at buildings that are open
10 to the public; and

11 WHEREAS, it is imperative that the government provide adequate security to protect
12 members of the public and public officials conducting official business at state and county
13 buildings.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that there is created the Senate
15 Study Committee on Security for State and County Buildings to be composed of five
16 members to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Assignments. Three members of the
17 committee shall be members of the Senate and two members of the committee shall have
18 expertise on security for buildings. The Senate Committee on Assignments shall designate
19 a member of the committee as chairperson of the committee. The chairperson shall call all
20 meetings of the committee.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions,
22 needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any actions

1 or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may
2 conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
3 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
4 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The legislative members of the
5 committee shall receive the allowances authorized for legislative members of interim
6 legislative committees but shall receive the same for not more than three days unless
7 additional days are authorized. The funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this
8 resolution shall come from the funds appropriated to the Senate. In the event the committee
9 makes a report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed
10 legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before December 31, 2005. The
11 committee shall stand abolished on December 31, 2005.
