4 of 21 and was one of nine children in a family that, at one time, had five children in World  
5 War II; and

6 WHEREAS, Mrs. Denton played a major role in the history of the United States Armed  
7 Forces, and serving as secretary to General Dwight D. Eisenhower, she typed the plans for  
8 the liberation of Europe, better known as D-Day; and

9 WHEREAS, Mrs. Denton has always been a devoted and tenacious advocate for the United  
10 States Armed Forces and the children of her community; and

11 WHEREAS, as an exemplary citizen and public servant, Mrs. Denton gives selflessly of her  
12 time, energy, and expertise as Post Commander of VFW 3650 and numerous military  
13 organizations and events within her community; and

14 WHEREAS, she has truly helped to improve the quality of life for veterans of Riverdale and  
15 Clayton County; and

16 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia is honored to have such a fine lady as one of its citizens.

18 the members of this body join in recognizing and commending Mrs. Helen Denton for her
